7	(e)(1) The transfer of the State Capitol Police under this section			
8	does not affect the orders, rules, regulations, directives, or standards made			
9	or promulgated prior to the effective date of the transfer under this			
10	section.			
11	(2) The orders, rules, regulations, directives, or standards			
12	under subdivision (e)(1) of this section shall continue with full force and			
13	effect until amended or repealed under authority given by law.			
14	(f) The Secretary of State shall provide the office space utilized by			
15	the State Capitol Police on the effective date of this act and other areas of			
16	the State Capitol utilized by the State Capitol Police, including without			
17	limitation areas used for monitoring equipment, at no cost to the Department			
18	of Public Safety for the continued use of the Division of State Capitol			
19	Police.			
20	(g) The Secretary of State shall continue to provide cleaning and			
21	general maintenance of the office space and areas of the State Capitol			
22	utilized by the Division of State Capitol Police.			
23	(h) The Secretary of State and the Department of Public Safety shall			
24	work cooperatively as necessary to enable the Division of State Capitol			
25	Police to provide for the security of the State Capitol.			
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27	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-60-213(a)(1)(A), concerning reduced			
28	tuition for certain police officers, is amended to read as follows:			
29	(1)(A) "Covered police officer" means:			
30	(i) An employee of the Division of Arkansas State			
31	Police who:			
32	(a) Holds the rank of state trooper or a			
33	higher rank; and			
34	(b) Has been an employee of the Division of			
35	Arkansas State Police for ten (10) or more years;			
36	(ii) A highway police officer who has been an			

employee of the Arkansas Highway Police Division of the Arkansas Department

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2 of Transportation for ten (10) or more years; 3 (iii) An officer of the Division of State Capitol 4 Police who has been an employee of the Division of State Capitol Police for 5 ten (10) or more years; or 6 (iv) A wildlife officer who has been an employee of 7 the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission for ten (10) or more years; or 8 (v) An officer of the Division of Law Enforcement Standards and Training who has been an employee of the Division of Law 9 Enforcement Standards and Training for ten (10) or more years. 10 11 12 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 12-9-208 is amended to read as follows: 12-9-208. Division of State Capitol Police - Training course. 13 14 All <u>commissioned</u> members of the <u>Division of</u> State Capitol Police shall 15 satisfactorily complete the basic training course for law enforcement 16 officers at the Arkansas Law Enforcement Training Academy that is certified 17 by the Arkansas Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training within 18 nine (9) months of their hire date or any extension granted by the Arkansas 19 Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Training commission. 20 21 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 12-14-101 is amended to read as follows: 22 12-14-101. Establishment - Powers. 23 (a) In such a manner as will most effectually secure the citizens and 24 their property in and around the State Capitol, the Secretary of State the 25 Department of Public Safety may: 26 (1) Establish the <u>Division of</u> State Capitol Police; 27 (2) Organize the Division of State Capitol Police; 28 (3) Prescribe the Division of State Capitol Police's duties; and 29 (4) Define the <u>Division of</u> State Capitol Police's powers. (b)(1) The Secretary of State secretary may designate and appoint one 30 31 (1) or more of his or her employees as State Capitol Police, who shall be peace officers under the laws of the state and shall have and possess all the 32 powers provided by the law for Arkansas State Police, city police, and county 33 sheriffs to be exercised as required for the protection of the State Capitol 34 35 grounds, together with such other duties as may be assigned by the Secretary 36 of State secretary.

1 (2) An officer of the <u>Division of State Capitol Police may act</u> 2 in his or her official capacity and exercise his or her powers anywhere 3 within the boundaries of the State of Arkansas.

(c) None of the present jurisdiction or powers of the Department <u>Division</u> of Arkansas State Police, county police, or city police shall be ceded to the <u>Division of State Capitol Police</u> over the land or property which constitutes the State Capitol grounds or within the boundaries of the State of Arkansas.

- SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 12-14-102 is amended to read as follows: 12-14-102. Duties Authority.
- (a) Except to the extent otherwise limited by the Secretary of State the Department of Public Safety, State Capitol Police appointed pursuant to the authority contained in this chapter shall:
 - (1) Protect property;
 - (2) Preserve and maintain proper order and decorum;
 - (3) Prevent unlawful assemblies and disorderly conduct;
- (4) Exclude and eject persons from and prevent trespass upon and in all of the State Capitol grounds and other grounds, buildings, improvements, streets, alleys, and sidewalks under control of the Secretary of State; and
 - (5) Have the authority to regulate the operation and parking of motor vehicles upon the State Capitol grounds and other grounds under control of the Secretary of State and upon all streets adjoining and traversing the State Capitol grounds, as long as it does not impede normal traffic patterns.
 - (b) The <u>Division of State Capitol Police officers shall have and exercise police supervision on behalf of the Secretary of State the Department of Public Safety and are authorized as peace officers to arrest, with or without warrant, any person upon or in the areas described in this section or within the boundaries of the State of Arkansas who is or is reasonably believed to be committing an offense against any laws of the State of Arkansas or against the ordinances of the city where the State Capitol grounds are located, and to deliver the person before any court of competent jurisdiction to be dealt with according to law.</u>

SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 12-14-103 is amended to read as follows:

1 12-14-103. Rules. 2 The Secretary of State the Department of Public Safety is hereby 3 authorized and empowered to promulgate rules, and to amend or change the same 4 from time to time as he or she shall deem necessary, providing for the 5 operation and organization of the Division of State Capitol Police, so long 6 as such rules are not arbitrary or capricious. 8 SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 12-14-105(b), concerning the prosecution of

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actions arising from the State Capitol Police, is amended to read as follows:

All fines which may be collected by any court on account of the violation of this chapter shall be remitted by the tenth day of each month to the Administration of Justice Funds Section of the Office of Administrative Services of the Department of Finance and Administration on a form provided by that office, to be deposited into the State Treasury and placed to the credit of the <u>Division of</u> State Capitol Police.

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- SECTION 8. Arkansas Code § 12-14-106 is amended to read as follows: 17 18 12-14-106. Additional salary payments.
 - (a) In the event that sufficient revenues in the judgment of the Secretary of State the Department of Public Safety exist, the Secretary of State secretary may make additional salary payments from those funds to those employees who have attained law enforcement certification above the basic certificate level, as defined by the Arkansas Commission on Division of Law Enforcement Standards and Training.
 - (b) It is the intent of this section that the payment shall be optional, at the discretion of the Secretary of State secretary, dependent on sufficient revenues, and shall not be implemented using funds specifically set aside for other programs within the office of the Secretary of State Department of Public Safety.
- 30 (c)(l) Employees shall be eligible for all or a portion of additional 31 salary payments scheduled as follows:
- 32 (A) General certificate - three hundred dollars (\$300)
- 33 annually;
- 34 (B) Intermediate certificate - six hundred dollars (\$600)

- 35 annually;
- 36 (C) Advanced certificate - nine hundred dollars (\$900)

4	(2) Payment of the additional salary amounts under this section:

9	quarterly, semiannually, or annually depending upon the availability of			
10	revenues and shall be restricted to the following classifications:			
11	(A) State Capitol Police Chief;			
12	(B) State Capitol Police Assistant Chief;			
13	(C) State Capitol Police sergeant; and			
14	(D) State Capitol Police corporal.			
15	(d)(1) Payments made under this section which are awarded as partial			
16	or lump-sum payments shall not be considered as salary for purposes of			
17	retirement benefits but shall be subject to withholding of all applicable			
18	federal and state taxes.			
19	(2) Payments made under this section shall not be construed as			
20	exceeding the maximum annual salary of the employee.			
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22	SECTION 9. Arkansas Code § 12-14-107 is amended to read as follows:			
23	12-14-107. Assignment of officer to Senate.			
24	(a)(1) Upon request, one (1) member of the <u>Division of</u> State Capitol			
25	Police shall be assigned to the Senate.			
26	(2) The officer shall be selected by the Chair of the Senate			
27	Efficiency Committee or his or her designee in charge of security procedures			
28	for the Senate.			
29	(b) The officer shall remain a full-time employee of the State Capitol			
30	Police division with accrued benefits and remain on duty with the State			
31	Capitol Police division when not on call with the Senate.			
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33	SECTION 10. Arkansas Code § 12-14-108 is amended to read as follows:			
34	12-14-108. Award of pistol upon retirement or death.			
35	When a <u>Division of</u> State Capitol Police officer retires from service or			
36	dies while still employed with the State Capital Police division, in			

1 recognition of and appreciation for the service of the retiring or deceased

- 2 officer, the Secretary of State the Department of Public Safety may award the
- 3 pistol carried by the officer at the time of his or her death or retirement
- 4 from service to:
- 5 (1) The officer; or
- 6 (2) The officer's spouse if the spouse is eligible under 7 applicable state and federal laws to possess a firearm.

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9 SECTION 11. Arkansas Code § 12-14-109 is amended to read as follows: 10 12-14-109. Certain records exempt.

A record or other information related to the operations, emergency
procedure, and security personnel of the <u>Division of</u> State Capitol Police is
confidential and not subject to disclosure under the Freedom of Information
Act of 1967, § 25-19-101 et seq., including without limitation:

- (1) Records or other information that upon disclosure could reasonably be expected to be detrimental to the public safety, including without limitation records or other information concerning emergency or security plans, State Capitol Building or Capitol Hill apartment complex safety plans, monitoring capabilities, procedures, risk assessments, studies, measures, or systems; and
- (2) Records or other information relating to the number of licensed security officers, certified <u>Division of State Capitol Police</u> officers, or other security personnel, as well as any personal information about a security officer, certified <u>Division of State Capitol Police</u> officer, or other security personnel.

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- SECTION 12. Arkansas Code, Appendix Title 19 Bond Issues, 12., § 13(d)(2), concerning the Capitol Mall Facility, is amended to read as follows:
- 30 (2) Upon completion of the construction phase of the Capitol
 31 Mall Facility project, the State Building Services shall develop parking
 32 regulations which will maintain equitable parking among the tenants of the
 33 Capitol Mall Facility and the public, and may establish reasonable rental or
 34 other charges for parking therein. The <u>Division of State Capitol Police</u>
 35 shall provide the necessary traffic patrols and policing of the Capitol Mall
 36 Facility parking areas.

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2 SECTION 13. Arkansas Code § 22-3-216(b)(1), concerning the Law

Enforcement Officers' Memorial, is amended to read as follows:

- (b)(1) The Governor shall designate a representative from the Division of Arkansas State Police, the Arkansas Sheriffs' Association, the Arkansas Fraternal Order of Police Foundation, Inc., and the Arkansas Municipal Police Association, who, together with a member of the <u>Division of</u> State Capitol
- 8 Police who is designated by the Secretary of State the Department of Public 9 Safety, shall constitute the Law Enforcement Officers' Memorial Design

10 Committee.

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- 12 SECTION 14. Arkansas Code § 22-3-403(b), concerning penalties for 13 violations of the traffic and parking rules of the Capitol Parking Control 14 Committee, is amended to read as follows:
- 15 (b) All fines which may be collected on account of violation of this 16 subchapter shall be paid into the State Treasury and placed to the credit of 17 the Division of State Capitol Police.

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- 19 SECTION 15. Arkansas Code § 22-3-404 is amended to read as follows: 20 22-3-404. Enforcement.
- 21 (a) In order that the provisions of this subchapter might be enforced, 22 the Director of the Division of Arkansas State Police may assign one (1) 23 state police officer or more to the State Capitol and its grounds, which may 24 include assignments for sessions of the General Assembly, and the Secretary
- 25 of State the Department of Public Safety is directed to assign one (1)
- 26 <u>Division of State Capitol Police officer or more. It shall be the</u>
- 27 responsibility of the Secretary of State <u>Division of State Capitol Police</u> to
- 28 assure that at least one (1) certified law enforcement officer is on duty on
- 29 the State Capitol grounds twenty-four (24) hours per day, seven (7) days per
- 30 week.
- 31 (b) Each <u>Division of State Capitol Police officer so assigned is</u>
 32 authorized to issue, upon determining a violation, a uniform traffic citation
 33 that shall be returnable in the Pulaski County District Court.

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35 SECTION 16. Arkansas Code § 22-3-1503 is amended to read as follows: 36 22-3-1503. Parking rules.

1 (a) The Building Authority Division shall develop parking rules which 2 will maintain equitable parking among the state agency tenants in the area described in § 22-3-1501 and for the public and may establish reasonable 3 4 rental or other charges for parking therein. 5 The Division of State Capitol Police shall provide the necessary 6 traffic patrols and policing of the parking facility. 7 8 SECTION 17. Arkansas Code § 24-4-101(34)(B)(i)(b), concerning the 9 definition of "public safety member", is amended to read as follows: 10 (b) "Police officer" includes a wildlife 11 officer of the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission, a drug enforcement 12 officer of a judicial drug taskforce, a civilian firefighter of the Department of the Military covered under § 24-4-1004, and all officers and 13 14 the Chief of the Division of State Capitol Police within the office of the 15 Secretary of State Department of Public Safety. 16 17 SECTION 18. Arkansas Code § 25-43-1402(a), concerning state entities 18 transferred to the Department of Public Safety, is amended to add an 19 additional subdivision to read as follows: 20 (18) The State Capitol Police, created under § 12-14-101, now 21 known as the "Division of State Capitol Police". 22 23 SECTION 19. Arkansas Code § 27-24-701 is amended to read as follows: 24 27-24-701. Purpose. 25 The purpose of this subchapter is to continue the procedure which 26 existed prior to April 13, 2005, for issuing special license plates to the 27 elected members of the General Assembly. These special license plates are 28 issued to honor the elected members of the General Assembly and to assist in 29 making parking rules for the State Capitol more enforceable by the <u>Division</u> of State Capitol Police. 30 31 SECTION 20. Arkansas Code § 27-24-801 is amended to read as follows: 32 27-24-801. Purpose. 33 The purpose of this subchapter is to continue the Constitutional 34 35 Officer special license plates that existed before April 13, 2005, to honor 36 the elected members of each constitutional office in the State of Arkansas

1	and to make the parking rules for the State Capitol more enforceable by the
2	<u>Division of</u> State Capitol Police.
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4	SECTION 21. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
5	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the State Capitol Police
6	preserves the public peace, health, and safety by virtue of the critical role
7	that it plays in providing security for the State Capitol Building; that this
8	act provides for the transfer of the State Capitol Police to the Department
9	of Public Safety; and that this act should become effective on July 1, 2021,
10	to coincide with the appropriation bills of the Department of Public Safety
11	and the Secretary of State and ensure that the State Capitol Police continues
12	to provide its vital services as the transfer is implemented and does not
13	experience any issues with funding under the transfer. Therefore, an
14	emergency is declared to exist, and this act being necessary for the
15	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective
16	on July 1, 2021.
