21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
22

23 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established
24 for the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2011-2012 fiscal
25 year, the following maximum number of regular employees.

8 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized, for
9 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2011-2012 fiscal
10 year, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be
11 known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such
12 purposes: six hundred twenty-five (625) temporary or part-time employees,
13 when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform
14 Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the
15 appropriate classification.

16

17 SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA
19 HELP - UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL PRN POOL. There is hereby authorized, for the
20 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, the following number of part-
21 time or temporary positions, to be known as "PRN Extra Help", payable from
22 funds appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing RN's and LPN's in a
23 Nursing PRN Pool: four hundred ten (410), when needed, at rates of pay not
24 to exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this Act.
25 If the agency requests continuation of a "PRN Extra Help" position(s) as
26 established herein during the next fiscal year, the extra help position(s)
27 must be requested as a new extra help position(s) in the agency's budget
28 request.

29 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
30 ~~2010~~ 2011 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2012.

32 SECTION 4. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
33 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA
34 HELP - UAMS TEMPS. There is hereby authorized for the University of Arkansas
35 for Medical Sciences, the following number of part-time or temporary
36 positions, to be known as "UAMS TEMPS/EXTRA HELP", payable from funds

1 appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing qualified individuals in a
2 UAMS Temporary Pool: Five hundred thirty (530), when needed, at rates of pay
3 not to exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this
4 Act.

5 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
6 ~~2010~~ 2011 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2012.

8 SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated,

 27 Indigent Care maintenance and general operations appropriations to be paid
 28 from cash funds of the institution, subject to reimbursement and correction
 29 of reporting, as provided by Arkansas Code 19-4-1609.

30 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
 31 ~~2010~~ 2011 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2012.

33 SECTION 35. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 34 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
 35 ESTABLISHMENT OF A "GROWTH POOL". (a) The Arkansas Department of Higher
 36 Education shall establish and maintain for the ~~2010-2011~~ 2011-2012 fiscal

1 year a pool of three hundred (300) nonclassified positions at a salary level
2 not to exceed \$293,550. These positions are to be used by the University of
3 Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that the personal services needs
4 of the University during the ~~2010-2011~~ 2011-2012 fiscal year exceed the
5 number of positions allocated to the University by the Legislature. The
6 University shall provide justification to the Arkansas Department of Higher
7 Education for the need to allocate titles from this "growth pool". No
8 classifications will be assigned to the pool until such time as specific
9 positions are requested by the University, approved by the University Board
10 or their designee, and approved by the Legislative Council. Furthermore, the
11 Office of Personnel Management (OPM) of the Division of Management Services
12 of the Department of Finance and Administration shall establish and maintain
13 for the ~~2010-2011~~ 2011-2012 fiscal year a pool of three hundred (300) career
14 service positions up to a C130. These positions are to be used by the
15 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that the personal
16 services needs of the University during the ~~2010-2011~~ 2011-2012 fiscal year
17 exceed the number of positions in a classification allocated to the
18 University by the Legislature. The University shall provide justification to
19 OPM for the need to allocate titles from this "growth pool". No
20 classifications will be assigned to the pool until such time as specific
21 positions are requested by the University, recommended by OPM, and approved
22 by the Legislative Council.

23 (b) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency is
24 the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by
25 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying the job titles and
26 the maximum grade or salary attached to those salaries. The General Assembly
27 has determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be
28 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution.
29 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing growth pools in
30 subsection (a) of this section and since the General Assembly has granted the
31 institution broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary
32 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the
33 utilization of the growth pool by requiring prior approval of the Legislative
34 Council in the utilization of the growth pool. Therefore, the requirement of
35 approval by the Legislative Council is not a severable part of this section.
36 If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council is ruled

1 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is
2 void.

3 If the agency requests continuation of a "Growth Pool" position(s) as
4 established herein during the next fiscal year, the position(s) must be
5 requested as a new position(s) in the agency's budget request.

6 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
7 ~~2010~~ 2011 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2012.

9 SECTION 36. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
10 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CHILD AND
11 FAMILY LIFE INSTITUTE. The Child Health and Family Life Institute shall be
12 administered under the direction of Arkansas Children's Hospital. Arkansas
13 Children's Hospital shall enter into a cooperative agreement and/or contract
14 with the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-Department of Pediatrics
15 for services required to deliver the programs of the Child Health and Family
16 Life Institute (CHFLI). Utilizing a multidisciplinary collaboration of
17 professionals, CHFLI shall provide a statewide effort to explore, develop and
18 evaluate new and better ways to address medically, socially and economically
19 interrelated health and developmental needs of children with special health
20 care needs and their families. CHFLI priorities shall include, but are not
21 limited to, wellness and prevention, screen and diagnosis, treatment and
22 intervention, training and education and research and evaluation. Arkansas
23 Children's Hospital and the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-
24 Department of Pediatrics shall make annual reports to the Arkansas
25 Legislative Council on all matters of funding, existing programs and services
26 offered through CHFLI.

27 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
28 ~~2010~~ 2011 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2012.

30 SECTION 37. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PARKING
32 FEES. On July 1 of each year the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences
33 shall pay from the appropriation provided herein from non-general revenue,
34 the total amount appropriated for War Memorial Stadium Commission Parking
35 Services from Fees to the War Memorial Stadium Commission.

36 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2010~~

1 2011 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2012.

 3 SECTION 38. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
 5 PROVISIONS. Because the Rural Medical Practice Student Loan and Scholarship
 6 Program Loans and/or Scholarships and the Community Match Student Loan and
 7 Scholarship Program Loans and/or Scholarships have the goal of providing
 8 primary care physicians in rural Arkansas, transfers may be made in such
 9 amounts as are required between the line items made in the appropriation for
 10 "Medical Loans and Scholarships".

11 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
 12 ~~2010~~ 2011 through June 30, ~~2011~~ 2012.

 14 SECTION 39. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 15 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CLINICAL
 16 EXPANSION AND RESEARCH POOL. (a) In order to address personnel needs emerging
 17 from expanding medical research and patient care issues and the necessity of
 18 recruiting and retaining qualified medical, research, and related support
 19 personnel, the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences or its successor
 20 is authorized for the ~~2010-2011~~ 2011-2012 fiscal year a pool of one thousand
 21 five hundred (1,500) "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions. These
 22 positions are to be used by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences
 23 in the event that the personal services needs resulting from unanticipated
 24 clinical or research programs that are initiated during the ~~2010-2011~~ 2011-
 25 2012 fiscal year require additional positions, either in title, in
 26 classification, or in number, that are not authorized or contemplated by the
 27 General Assembly in Section 1 of this Act.

28 These "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions may also be used
 29 to properly classify positions when the University of Arkansas for Medical
 30 Sciences does not have a vacant position available with the appropriate
 31 title, grade, or salary level. The salary rates for these positions shall
 32 not exceed the highest maximum annual salary rate or the highest grade level
 33 position authorized by the General Assembly in Section 1 of this Act, as
 34 governed by the uniform Classification and Compensation Act of 1969, §21-5-
 35 201 et seq., or its successor.

36 (b) The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is authorized to

1 access the "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions authorized in
 2 this Section at any time during the fiscal year when it is determined by the
 3 Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, subject to the
 4 review and approval by the Board of Trustees, that the need for additional
 5 positions exists. The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical
 6 Sciences shall provide a quarterly report detailing the justification of
 7 allocation of positions from this "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" to
 8 the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, to the Department of Higher Education,
 9 and to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee for review.
 10 The report shall also include an accounting of the names, titles and salaries
 11 of personnel who have been employed in positions established from this pool
 12 and the source and duration of funds associated with the positions.

13 (c) If the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences requests
 14 continuation of any "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" position(s) as
 15 established herein during the next fiscal year, the position(s) must be
 16 requested as a new position(s) in the agency's budget request.

17 (d) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state
 18 agency is the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished
 19 by delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying job titles and
 20 the maximum grade or salary attached to those titles. The General Assembly
 21 has determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be
 22 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution.
 23 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing a position pool in
 24 Subsection (a) of this Section and since the General Assembly has granted the
 25 agency broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary and
 26 appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the utilization
 27 of the position pool by requiring review of the Legislative Council or Joint
 28 Budget Committee in the utilization of the position pool. Therefore, the
 29 requirement of review by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is
 30 not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of review by the
 31 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a
 32 court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

33 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,

SECTION 40. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds

1 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
2 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
3 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
4 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
5 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
6 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
7 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
8 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
9 with in disbursement of said funds.

10
11 SECTION 41. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
12 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
13 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
14 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
15 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
16 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
17 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
18 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

19
20 SECTION 42. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
21 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
22 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
23 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2011 is essential to the operation of
24 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
25 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
26 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2011 could work irreparable harm
27 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
28 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
29 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
30 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2011.
