9	AN ACT TO AMEND THE EMBALMERS AND FUNERAL DIRECTORS	
10	LAW; TO REVISE THE QUALIFICATIONS TO OBTAIN A LICENSE	
11	UNDER THE EMBALMERS AND FUNERAL DIRECTORS LAW; TO	
12	MODIFY THE REQUIREMENTS OF A FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT TO	
13	CONDUCT EMBALMING; TO AMEND THE REQUIREMENTS TO	
14	OPERATE A FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT; TO CLARIFY THE	
15	PROCEDURE TO ISSUE A TEMPORARY WORKING NUMBER TO AN	
16	OUT-OF-STATE LICENSEE; TO REQUIRE A CREMATORIUM TO	
17	PROVIDE PROOF OF GENERAL LIABILITY INSURANCE TO THE

23	TO AMEND THE EMBALMERS AND FUNERAL	
24	DIRECTORS LAW.

27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
28		
29	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 17-29-301 is amended to read as follow	s:
30	17-29-301. Embalmers — Qualifications.	
31	(a) Every $\underline{\mathtt{A}}$ person who desires to practice the science of embalmi	ng in
32	this state shall:	
33	(1) Be at least eighteen (18) years of age;	
34	(2) Be a graduate of an accredited high school or the equiv	alent
35	thereof;	
36	(3) Be a graduate of a school of embalming mortuary science	<u> </u>

1	which that is accredited by the American Board of Funeral Service Education
2	or accredited by the State Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors;
3	(4) Make a written application to the State Board of Embalmers
4	and Funeral Directors attaching the fee as prescribed in § 17-29-208;
5	(5) Have served as a registered apprentice embalmer for not less
6	than twelve (12) months in the State of Arkansas under the direct personal
7	supervision of an Arkansas-licensed embalmer and submit at least fifty (50)
8	case reports to the State Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors; and
9	(6) $(A)$ Take and pass both parts of the National Board
10	Examination and the Arkansas laws, rules, and regulations exam; and
11	(7)(A) Have passed an examination approved by the State Board of
12	Embalmers and Funeral Directors.
13	(B) Applicants shall be given a written examination on the
14	<pre>following:</pre>
15	(i) Arkansas laws;
16	(ii) Arkansas rules; and
17	(iii) Any federal regulations that the State Board
18	of Embalmers and Funeral Directors deems necessary.
19	(C) To be eligible to take the Arkansas laws, rules, and
20	regulations exam examination described in subdivision (a)(7)(B) of this
21	section, an applicant shall be an active apprentice who is currently
22	registered with the <del>board</del> <u>State Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors</u> .
23	(b)(1) Any $\underline{A}$ person desiring to engage in the science of embalming in
24	this state, in addition to graduating from an approved college of mortuary
25	science recognized by the <del>State Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors</del>
26	American Board of Funeral Service Education, shall serve an apprenticeship of
27	at least one (1) year in the State of Arkansas <del>under an embalmer licensed by</del>
28	the State Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors and shall assist in the
29	preparation of at least fifty (50) bodies under the direct personal
30	supervision of an Arkansas-licensed embalmer.
31	(2)(A) This apprenticeship shall be registered with the State
32	Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors on applications provided by the
33	State Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors.
34	(B) Individual case reports shall be signed by both the
35	apprentice and the licensed embalmer under whose supervision the work was
36	done and filed with the State Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors by the

- 1 tenth day of the following month.
- 2 (3)(A) An apprenticeship under this subsection may begin not
- 3 more than twelve (12) months before enrollment in an accredited college of
- 4 mortuary science or by submitting proof of graduation from an accredited
- 5 college of mortuary science.
- 6 (B) If an apprentice fails to enroll in an accredited
- 7 college of mortuary science as required under subdivision (b)(3)(A) of this
- 8 section, the apprenticeship shall be terminated for a period to be determined
- 9 by rule of the State Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors.
- 10 (c) The State Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors may suspend or
- 11 revoke an applicant's apprenticeship for violating this subchapter or § 17-
- 12 <u>29-201 et seq.</u>

- SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-29-302 is amended to read as follows:
- 15 17-29-302. Funeral directors Qualifications.
- 16 (a) Every  $\underline{A}$  person who desires to engage in the business of funeral
- 17 directing in this state shall:
- 18 (1) Be at least eighteen (18) years of age;
- 19 (2) Be a graduate of an accredited high school or the equivalent
- 20 thereof;
- 21 (3)(A) Have served as an apprentice funeral director for not
- 22 less than twenty-four (24) eighteen (18) months in the State of Arkansas
- 23 under the direct personal supervision of an Arkansas-licensed funeral
- 24 director.
- 25 (B) Completion of the requirement to be a graduate of a
- 26 school of embalmers mortuary science as set forth in § 17-29-301(a)(3) may be
- 27 substituted for twelve (12) six (6) of the twenty four (24) eighteen (18)
- 28 months' apprenticeship established in this section;
- 29 (4) Make application to the State Board of Embalmers and Funeral
- 30 Directors and attach the fee as prescribed in § 17-29-208; and
- 31 (5)(A) Take and pass all examinations required by the board <u>Have</u>
- 32 passed an examination approved by the board as described in § 17-29-
- 33 301(a)(7).
- 34 (B) To be eligible to take the Arkansas laws, rules, and
- 35 regulations exam examination required under subdivision (a)(5)(A) of this
- 36 <u>section</u>, an applicant shall be an active apprentice who is currently

- 1 registered with the board.
- 2 (b)(1)(A) Except as provided in subdivision (b)(1)(C) of this section,
- 3  $\frac{A}{A}$  person desiring to engage in the business of funeral directing in this
- 4 state shall serve an apprenticeship in this state for two (2) years no less
- 5 than eighteen (18) months.
- 6 (B) An apprentice shall:
- 7 (i) Register with the board on forms provided by the
- 8 board and by attaching the fee as prescribed in § 17-29-208;
- 9 (ii) Be Upon registration with the board, be
- 10 supervised by a funeral director licensed by the board; and
- 11 (iii) Actively assist in arranging fifty (50)
- 12 services as determined by rule of the board; and
- 13 (iv) File with the board individual case reports for
- 14 services arranged by the apprentice, signed by the apprentice and the
- 15 <u>licensed funeral director under whose supervision the work was done, by the</u>
- 16 tenth day of the following month.
- 17 (C) A person who is a graduate of an accredited mortuary
- 18 program and has passed the National Board Examination may be licensed to
- 19 engage in the business of funeral directing after serving an apprenticeship
- 20 in this state for one (1) year.
- 21 (2) A Before the start of the apprenticeship, a licensed funeral
- 22 director who is supervising an apprenticeship shall record a notice of the
- 23 apprenticeship with the Secretary-treasurer of the State Board of Embalmers
- 24 and Funeral Directors or the Executive Secretary of the State Board of
- 25 Embalmers and Funeral Directors no later than thirty (30) days after the
- 26 start of the apprenticeship.
- 27 (3) The board may suspend or revoke an applicant's
- 28 apprenticeship <u>for a funeral director</u> for a violation of this subchapter or §
- 29 17-29-201 et seq.
- 30 (4) Within a reasonable amount of time after the effective date
- 31 of this subchapter, a person who is currently in an apprenticeship under this
- 32 section shall be subject to the provisions in this section concerning an
- 33 apprenticeship as determined by rules of the board.
- 34 (c) (1) The board  $\frac{may}{may}$  shall require applicants for licensure as funeral
- 35 directors to successfully complete up to twenty (20) hours of classroom
- 36 instruction in funeral service practices and ethics, and laws, rules, and

1	regulations affecting funeral service.
2	(2) Only courses of instruction approved by the board shall
3	satisfy this the requirement in subdivision (c)(1) of this section.
4	
5	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 17-29-303(d), concerning examinations and
6	certificates for embalmers and funeral directors, is amended to read as
7	follows:
8	(d) Every license holder or certificate issued by the board under
9	subsection (b) of this section shall $\underline{be}$ maintain his or her license in a
10	convenient place in his or her office or displayed in each place of business
11	of the licensee.
12	
13	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 17-29-304(a), concerning the requirements
14	to conduct a funeral establishment, is amended to add additional subdivisions
15	to read as follows:
16	(3) A funeral establishment shall:
17	(A) Establish a permanent place of business;
18	(B) Maintain a working telephone number for the funeral
19	establishment;
20	(C) Maintain working public utilities, including running
21	water, electricity, and a functioning heating and cooling system; and
22	(D) Ensure that the interior of the funeral establishment
23	is protected from exposure to outside elements.
24	(4) A funeral establishment may display a sign at each location
25	of the funeral establishment that indicates the registered name of the
26	funeral establishment on file with the board.
27	
28	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 17-29-304(e)(1), concerning a preparation
29	room for embalming, is amended to add additional subdivisions to read as
30	follows:
31	(e)(1) A funeral establishment that conducts embalming shall have a
32	preparation room for embalming that has:
33	(A) Sanitary floors, walls, and ceilings that are
34	constructed from a washable surface;
35	(B) Adequate sanitary drainage and disposal facilities,
36	including hot and cold running water;

1	(C) An exhaust system that provides proper ventilation
2	according to the standards and regulations of the $\underline{\text{United States}}$ Occupational
3	Safety and Health Administration for the prevention of the spread of
4	contagious, infectious, or communicable diseases; and
5	(D) A heating and cooling system that is separate from the
6	rest of the funeral establishment;
7	(E) Privacy coverings on doorways and windows that prevent
8	viewing of the preparation room and the contents of the preparation room;
9	(F) A functional lock that prevents unauthorized entrance
10	to the preparation room;
11	(G) A biohazard waste disposal system that is compliant
12	with § 20-32-101 et seq. and as may be permitted by the rules of the
13	Department of Health pertaining to the segregation, packaging, storage,
14	transportation, treatment, and disposal of commercial medical waste from
15	healthcare-related facilities; and
16	(H) Other requirements as described by rule of the board.
17	
18	SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 17-29-304(g), concerning the requirements
19	to operate a funeral establishment, is amended to add additional subdivisions
20	to read as follows:
21	(g) A funeral establishment shall:
22	(1) Contain a separate conference room that is used to make
23	funeral arrangements; and
24	(2) Display on site a reasonable number of caskets as determined
25	by the board <u>;</u>
26	(3) Maintain proper care and maintenance of the interior and
27	exterior of the funeral establishment; and
28	(4) Maintain the interior and exterior of the funeral
29	establishment in a manner that does not present a potential or actual hazard
30	to the health, safety, or welfare of the public.
31	
32	SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 17-29-304, concerning the operation of a
33	funeral establishment, is amended to add additional subsections to read as
34	follows:
35	(k) Multiple funeral establishments are not permitted to share the
36	same physical location without the prior approval of the board.

1	(1)(1) A funeral establishment shall maintain at least one $(1)$
2	refrigeration unit or have access to a refrigeration unit within a reasonable
3	time after death as determined by rule of the board.
4	(2) Accessibility to a refrigeration unit by a funeral
5	establishment shall be reported as determined by rule of the board.
6	(3) A multiunit funeral establishment enterprise is required to
7	maintain at least one (1) refrigeration unit in this state.
8	
9	SECTION 8. Arkansas Code § 17-29-310(b), concerning the license
10	requirements for out-of-state licensees, is amended to read as follows:
11	(b)(1) An application shall be made by filing with the Secretary-
12	treasurer of the State Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors or the
13	Executive Secretary of the State Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors a
14	certified statement from the secretary of the examining board of the state,
15	United States territory, or provincial authority in which the applicant holds
16	his or her license, showing the basis upon which the license was issued.
17	(2) Upon receipt of the application and fee, the secretary-
18	treasurer of the board or the executive <del>director</del> <u>secretary</u> of the board may
19	issue a temporary working number that is valid for one (1) year from the date
20	of issuance.
21	
22	SECTION 9. Arkansas Code § 17-29-313(c)(2), concerning requirements
23	for operation of a crematorium, is amended to add an additional subdivision
24	to read as follows:
25	(E)(i) Provide proof of general liability insurance.
26	(ii) The board shall develop and promulgate rules
27	requiring sufficient and appropriate minimum levels of general liability
28	insurance coverage for licensed crematoriums.
