1	conditions at these sites, it is not always possible to determine the
2	existence or identity of parties responsible or to conclusively establish
3	legal and financial liability for remediation under existing law;
4	(3) Due to these conditions and the volume of improperly
5	disposed solid waste and used tires at these sites of environmental concern
6	and the expense of cleanup and remediation, coupled with the inability to
7	establish conclusive legal liability for their creation or identify available
8	and recoverable assets to effectuate satisfactory remediation, these sites
9	continue to pose hazards to the environment, health, and human safety and
10	remain blights on the communities in which they are located; and
11	(4) There is a compelling public interest in providing a
12	solution to clean up these sites when existing legal remedies to identify the
13	responsible parties and hold them financially accountable have been
14	ineffective, and there is no other readily available means to protect the
15	health and safety of communities, citizens, and the environment.
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17	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 8, Chapter 1, Subchapter 1, is amended
18	to add an additional section to read as follows:
19	8-1-108. Eligible environmental site remediation — Tax credit.
20	(a)(1) The Division of Environmental Quality shall designate a list of
21	environmental sites in Arkansas that require:
22	(A) Removal and subsequent disposal of solid waste or
23	tires to a permitted disposal site, permitted transfer station, or permitted
24	processing facility; and
25	(B) Remediation.
26	(2) Each designated site listed under subdivision (a)(1) of this
27	section shall include a dollar amount associated with the estimated cost of
28	necessary cleanup and remediation.
29	(b) The division shall administer the Division of Environmental
30	Quality Designated Environmental Site Remediation Trust Fund to accept and
31	provide funding for environmental cleanup and remediation activities at
32	designated sites under this section.
33	(c)(l) A private entity may apply to the division for a determination
34	of eligibility to provide funding as a donor for the remediation of \underline{a}
35	designated environmental site on the list maintained under subsection (a) of
36	this section

1	(2) The division shall determine the eligibility of a proposed		
2	donor's request under subdivision (c)(1) of this section.		
3	(3) Upon a determination of eligibility, the division shall:		
4	(A) Deposit the funding from the donor in the fund;		
5	(B) Enter into a contract with a private contractor to		
6	provide cleanup and remediation of the designated environmental remediation		
7	site;		
8	(C) Approve an appropriate remedial action plan and		
9	oversee the execution of the approved remedial action plan for site cleanup		
10	and remediation by the private contractor; and		
11	(D) Provide expenditures from the fund to the private		
12	contractor according to the terms of the contract.		
13	(d) Upon completion of the contract under subdivision (c)(3)(B) of		
14	this section, the designated environmental site shall be certified by the		
15	division as satisfactorily remediated.		
16	(e) Upon division certification that a site is satisfactorily		
17	remediated, the division shall issue the eligible donor a certificate		
18	reflecting the amount of donated funding used for the completed cleanup and		
19	remediation of the designated site.		
20	(f) An eligible donor under this section who receives certification		
21	under subsection (e) of this section is allowed an income tax credit under		
22	<u>26-51-515.</u>		
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24	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 19, Chapter 5, Subchapter 11, is		
25	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:		
26	19-5-1155. Division of Environmental Quality Designated Environmental		
27	Site Remediation Trust Fund.		
28	(a) There is created on the books of the Treasurer of State, the		
29	Auditor of State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a trust fund to		
30	be known as the "Division of Environmental Quality Designated Environmental		
31	Site Remediation Trust Fund".		
32	(b) The fund shall consist of:		
33	(1) Grants, donations, or transfers made by any person or		
34	government agency or office; and		
35	(2) Any other funds authorized or provided by law.		
36	(c) The fund shall be used for the purposes set out in § 8-1-108.		

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2	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code Title 26, Chapter 51, Subchapter 5, is		
3	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:		
4	26-51-515. Designated environmental site remediation tax credit.		
5	(a)(l) There is allowed a tax credit against the income tax imposed b		
6	the Income Tax Act of 1929, § 26-51-101 et seq., for a donation to aid in		
7	cleanup and remediation of designated environmental sites under § 8-1-108		
8	designated on the certificate reflecting the eligible donation of funds for		
9	$\underline{\text{completed}}$ environmental cleanup and remediation issued by the Division of		
10	Environmental Quality pursuant to § 8-1-108(e).		
11	(2) The tax credit under this section shall be claimed within		
12	one (1) year after the taxpayer receives the certificate of funding under §		
13	<u>8-1-108(e).</u>		
14	(b) The amount of the income tax credit under this section that may be		
15	claimed by the taxpayer in a tax year shall not exceed the amount of income		
16	tax due by the taxpayer.		
17	(c)(1) The total amount of tax credits that may be awarded in any tax		
18	year shall not exceed two million dollars (\$2,000,000).		
19	(2) If the Department of Finance and Administration receives		
20	claims for tax credit under this section that exceed the cap in this		
21	subsection in a single tax year, then the department shall prorate the credit		
22	to all eligible taxpayers claiming the credit based on their eligible		
23	donations under § 8-1-108(e).		
24	(d) The Secretary of the Department of Finance and Administration may		
25	promulgate rules to implement this section.		
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27	SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.		
28	This act is effective for tax years beginning on January 1, 2021, and		
29	expires on December 31, 2023.		
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
