Arkansas Code § 6-18-505(c), concerning the School 25 Discipline Act, is repealed. 26 (c)(1) Any teacher or school administrator in a school district that 27 authorizes use of corporal punishment in the district's written student discipline policy may use corporal punishment, provided only that the 28 punishment is administered in accord with the district's written student 29 discipline policy, against any pupil in order to maintain discipline and 30 31 order within the public schools. 32 (2) As used in subdivision (c)(1) of this section, "teachers and 33 administrators" means those persons employed by a school district and 34 required to have a state-issued educator license as a condition of their 35 employment. 36
