- 24 LIVING INCREASES AND MERIT PAY. Employees of the Arkansas Game and Fish
- 25 Commission shall be eligible for cost-of-living and merit pay adjustments at
- 26 the discretion of the Commission. In addition, the Commission is authorized
- 27 to develop and establish a merit pay system. The merit system developed by
- 28 the Commission must be reviewed by the Arkansas Legislative Council, or if
- 29 the General Assembly is in session, the Joint Budget Committee. The
- 30 Commission may establish merit payments as either an increase to an

LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 18 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 19 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 20 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 21 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 22 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 23 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 24 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 25 26 SECTION 18. EMERGENCY CLAUSE.
