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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

22 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the
23 Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission for the 2019-2020 fiscal year, the
24 following maximum number of regular employees.

16 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for the Arkansas
 17 State Game and Fish Commission for the 2019-2020 fiscal year, the following
 18 maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra
 19 Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: one hundred
 20 eighty-five (185) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of
 21 pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and
 22 Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate
 23 classification.

25 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated,
 26 to the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission, to be payable from the Game
 27 Protection Fund, for personal services and operating expenses of the Arkansas
 28 State Game and Fish Commission for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020, the
 29 following:

 33 or other eligible entities for operating, equipment, and maintenance expenses

There is hereby appropriated, to the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission, to be payable from the Game Protection Fund, for personal services, operating expenses and grants for the eradication efforts of feral hogs of the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020, the following:

SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. HUNTERS FEEDING THE HUNGRY. Arkansas Hunters Feeding the Hungry is designed to share the harvest of an abundant resource with Arkansans who are in need of food, partner with the Game and Fish Commission in order to provide a solution for a healthy, balanced deer herd, provide a much needed free, low fat, high protein food source to the many feeding agencies and organizations across Arkansas and create a provider purpose for hunters who participate, allowing them to give back and share with others. In order to help sustain the Arkansas Hunters Feeding the Hungry program in Arkansas the Arkansas Game and

1 Fish Commission may establish a check off or other appropriate methods to
2 raise revenue for support of the program. The intent of this Section is to
3 encourage the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission to examine opportunities
4 available to provide support for the Arkansas Hunters Feeding the Hungry
5 program.

6 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2018~~
7 2019 through June 30, ~~2019~~ 2020.

8
9 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
10 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PAYMENT
11 OF REWARDS. Payment of rewards shall be from the Game Protection Fund from
12 the Commission's Maintenance and General Operation appropriation as herein
13 appropriated in the Operating Expenses line item of the Operations
14 appropriation.

15 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2018~~
16 2019 through June 30, ~~2019~~ 2020.

17
18 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
19 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA
20 HELP RESTRICTION. No employee of the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission who is
21 employed as extra help may receive an amount to exceed eighty-five percent
22 (85%) of the maximum annual salary for a comparable position as authorized
23 under § 21-5-201 et seq. during any fiscal year, nor shall such an employee
24 be employed for a period of time to exceed one thousand eight hundred (1,800)
25 hours in any single fiscal year.

26 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2018~~
27 2019 through June 30, ~~2019~~ 2020.

28
29 SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
30 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
31 PROVISION. After receiving approval from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
32 State, and prior review by the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget
33 Committee, the Agency is authorized to transfer appropriation from any line
34 item authorized in the Operations appropriation to any other line item
35 authorized in the Operations appropriation and the Agency is authorized to
36 transfer appropriation from any line item authorized in the Gas Lease

1 Revenues appropriation to any other line item authorized in the same section.

2 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2018~~
3 2019 through June 30, ~~2019~~ 2020.

4
5 SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
6 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. OVERTIME.
7 The Arkansas Game and Fish Commission is hereby authorized to make overtime
8 payments from such funds and appropriations provided for overtime payments to
9 those wildlife officers or other employees that are currently assigned or may
10 be assigned by the Director of the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission or by an
11 appointed designate to Special Law Enforcement Task Forces, Special
12 Operations, and other special programs reimbursable to the Arkansas Game and
13 Fish Commission by federal or local authorities as approved by the Director
14 of the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission. All such overtime payments shall
15 be processed through the State Accounting System and shall be in addition to
16 the Regular Salaries and benefits accruing to the employee(s). Payment of
17 overtime is the preferred method of implementing the provisions of this
18 section.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2018~~
20 2019 through June 30, ~~2019~~ 2020.

21
22 SECTION 13. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
23 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PAYMENT
24 OF ACCRUED LEAVE. The Arkansas Game and Fish Commission is hereby authorized
25 to pay all accrued and unused annual, holiday, and sick leave to the estate
26 of any wildlife officer who dies in the line of duty. Such payments are
27 subject to budgetary constraints and shall be disbursed after receipt of the
28 official death certificate.

29 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2018~~
30 2019 through June 30, ~~2019~~ 2020.

31
32 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
33 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
34 COMPENSATION DIFFERENTIALS. To address specific employee compensation needs,
35 the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission (the Commission) is authorized to pay
36 compensation differentials to employees occupying regularly appropriated

1 positions. All compensation differentials must be reviewed by the Arkansas
2 Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint
3 Budget Committee. The Commission must demonstrate the need for a
4 compensation differential and submit a plan to the Arkansas Legislative
5 Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint Budget Committee
6 identifying the classifications or positions eligible for such differentials.
7 Compensation differentials that may be authorized under this section are
8 shift differentials, hazardous duty, certification, and second language in an
9 amount not to exceed twelve percent (12%) of an employee's base salary. The
10 cumulative total of any compensation differentials paid to an employee under
11 this section shall not exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the employee's
12 base salary. An employee who receives additional compensation under this
13 section who moves into a position that is not authorized to receive the
14 compensation differential shall have the compensation differential removed.
15 If granting additional compensation would have the effect of exceeding the
16 line item maximum assigned to the employee's classification, the additional
17 compensation shall not be construed as exceeding the line item maximum for
18 that classification.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2018~~
20 2019 through June 30, ~~2019~~ 2020.

21

22 SECTION 15. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
23 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. COST OF
24 LIVING INCREASES AND MERIT PAY. Employees of the Arkansas Game and Fish
25 Commission shall be eligible for cost-of-living and merit pay adjustments at
26 the discretion of the Commission. In addition, the Commission is authorized
27 to develop and establish a merit pay system. The merit system developed by
28 the Commission must be reviewed by the Arkansas Legislative Council, or if
29 the General Assembly is in session, the Joint Budget Committee. The
30 Commission may establish merit payments as either an increase to an
31 employee's base salary or as a lump sum payment, based on sufficiency of
32 funding. Commission employees shall be evaluated using an instrument
33 developed by the Commission that incorporates performance evaluation
34 standards. Employees reaching the maximum rate of pay for their respective
35 classifications may receive merit pay or cost of living adjustments in a lump
36 sum payment, provided adjustments are awarded; the additional compensation

1 shall not be construed as exceeding the line item maximum for that
2 classification.

3 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2018
4 2019 through June 30, ~~2019~~ 2020.

5
6 SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

8 PROMOTIONAL ITEMS. The Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission is hereby
9 authorized to purchase from the Maintenance & General Operation
10 Classifications in the Operations Appropriation provided by this Act for
11 promotional items in an amount not to exceed fifty thousand dollars
12 (\$50,000), as authorized by the Director of the Commission to meet fish and
13 wildlife conservations and education needs.

14 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2019
15 through June 30 2020.

16
17 SECTION 17. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
18 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
19 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
20 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
21 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
22 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
23 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
24 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

25
26 SECTION 18. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
27 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
28 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
29 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2019 is essential to the operation of
30 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
31 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
32 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2019 could work irreparable harm
33 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
34 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
35 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
36 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2019.
