SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 9 PRIORITIES. A high priority of the College of The Ouachitas shall be to 10 combat illiteracy and to provide industrial training in the work place. 11 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2015 12 2016 through June 30, 2016 2017. 13 14 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 15 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. HENDERSON 16 STATE UNIVERSITY AND COLLEGE OF THE OUACHITAS COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT. 17 The General Assembly finds that: (a) 18 (1) Henderson State University and College of The Ouachitas are 19 two institutions of Higher Education with a long history of cooperation and 20 mutual support for the pursuit of their missions to serve the residents of 21 their overlapping service areas; 22 (2) These institutions have entered into an agreement to 23 continue the goodwill that has been established between them and throughout 24 the communities they serve, and to enhance the level of services to the 25 residents of Clark County without duplicating efforts; and 26 (3) Working strategically, the institutions can meet the needs 27 of the residents of Clark County in a manner that fosters partnership and 28 collaboration. 29 (b) Based upon the agreement of the parties: 30 (1) College of The Ouachitas shall: 31 Limit any offerings in Clark County to non-academic, (A) 32 technical courses and programs that are not offered at Henderson State 33 University; 34 (B) Not offer any academic courses or programs, including 35 remediation, in Clark County; 36 (C)(i) Notify, meet, and discuss with Henderson State

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1 University prior to offering any new credit-bearing technical programs in

2 Clark County.

3 (ii) To minimize confusion, any such offering will be
4 delivered in conjunction with the Community Education Center; and
5 (D) Only establish a physical presence in Clark County in
6 partnership with Henderson State University's Community Education Center; and
7 (2)(A) Henderson State University shall offer to College of The

8 Ouachitas the first right of refusal for the instruction of technical 9 training courses and programs requested by business and industry that cannot 10 be provided directly by Henderson State University.

11 (B) The courses and programs shall be provided at the 12 Community Education Center or within Clark County.

13 (c) The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July
14 1, 2015 2016 through June 30, 2016 2017.

16 SECTION 7. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 17 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 18 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 19 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 20 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 21 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures 22 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this 23 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of 24 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied 25 with in disbursement of said funds.

27 SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 28 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 29 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 30 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 31 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 32 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 33 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 34 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 35

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SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General

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1	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
2	appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
3	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2016 is essential to the operation of
4	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
5	the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
6	effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2016 could work irreparable harm
7	upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
8	programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
9	being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
10	and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2016.
