17	WHEREAS, Roland A. Hicks, Jr., was born in Norphlet, Arkansas,
18	graduated from high school there, and moved to Hope, Arkansas, in 1932; and
19	
20	WHEREAS, Mr. Hicks attended Gupton-Jones School of Embalming in
21	Nashville, Tennessee and when Mr. Hicks graduated from embalming school,
22	Grant Davenport and Professor J. W. Walker, the grandfather of attorney John
23	Walker, were there and asked Mr. Hicks to come to Hope, Arkansas, to open a
24	Black funeral home; and

26 2 <b>7</b>	WHEREAS, Rufus Herndon of Herndon Funeral Home gave Mr. Hicks equipment
27	to get him started in the business when he first returned to Hope as there
28	was a building behind the Herndon Funeral Home where Black persons were taken
29	to be embalmed; and
30	LHEDEAC Mr. Highe around his furnarel home Morrob 0, 102/, and the first
31	WHEREAS, Mr. Hicks opened his funeral home March 9, 1934, and the first
32	location was in a strip mall; and
33 34	WHEREAS, in addition to the Hicks Funeral Home, the location was also
35	home to a doctor's office, a typesetter, a Black theater, and a restaurant;

2	WHEREAS, the Hicks Funeral Home moved locations twice and is currently
3	located at 407 South Hazel Street, Hope, Arkansas, where the business has
4	been for the last fifty (50) years; and
5	
6	WHEREAS, at the time, Black persons, who were paying insurance plans
7	for burial, were told by Mr. Herndon to use the services of the Hicks Funeral
8	Home and Mr. Hicks would travel the state to embalming seminars as he was
9	considered the best in the state at that time; and
10	
11	WHEREAS, Mr. Hicks would get meat, vegetables, fruit, and milk in
12	exchange for down payments on the burial insurance plan and he was proud to
13	come home with whatever his community members could afford as a down payment;
14	and
15	
16	WHEREAS, from those meager down payments to what has been built at
17	Hicks Funeral Home, the services provided to the community are a source of
18	pride for the owners and employees; and
19	
20	WHEREAS, Mr. Hicks became a successful businessman and left his legacy
21	to his family and the city of Hope; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, on March 9, 2023, Hicks Funeral Homes will celebrate eighty-
24	nine (89) years of providing service to Hope and surrounding areas and the
25	legacy of Mr. Hicks now continues through the fourth generation of licensed
26	funeral directors at the funeral home,
