- 4 17-309. Violations: classification
- 5 A. Unless otherwise prescribed by this title, it is unlawful for a 6 person to:
- 7 1. Violate any provision of this title or any rule adopted pursuant 8 to this title.
- 9 2. Take, possess, transport, release, buy, sell or offer or expose 10 for sale wildlife except as expressly permitted by this title.
- 11 3. Destroy, injure or molest livestock, growing crops, personal
- 12 property, notices or signboards[—] or other improvements while hunting,
- 13 trapping or fishing.
- 4. Discharge a firearm while taking wildlife within one-fourth mile
- 15 of an occupied farmhouse or other residence, cabin, lodge or building
- 16 without permission of the owner or resident.
- 5. Take a game bird, game mammal or game fish and knowingly
- 18 [permit][ALLOW] an edible portion thereof to go to waste, except as
- 19 provided in section 17-302.

- 1 6. Take big game, except bear or mountain lion, with the aid of 2 dogs.
- 3 7. Make more than one use of a shipping permit or coupon issued by 4 the commission.
- 8. Obtain a license or take wildlife during the period for which the person's license has been revoked or suspended or the person has been denied a license.
- 8 9. Litter hunting and fishing areas while taking wildlife.
- 9 10. Take wildlife during the closed season.
- 10 11. Take wildlife in an area closed to the taking of that wildlife.
- 11 12. Take wildlife with an unlawful device.
- 12 13. Take wildlife by an unlawful method.
- 13 14. Take wildlife in excess of the bag limit.
- 14 15. Possess wildlife in excess of the possession limit.
- 16. Possess or transport any wildlife or parts of the wildlife that 16 was unlawfully taken.
- 17. Possess or transport the carcass of big game without a valid tag 18 being attached.
- 19 18. Use the edible parts of any game mammal or any part of any game 20 bird or nongame bird as bait.
- 21 19. Possess or transport the carcass or parts of a carcass of any 22 wildlife that cannot be identified as to species and legality.
- 23 20. Take game animals, game birds and game fish with an explosive 24 compound, $[\underline{A}]$ poison or any other deleterious substances.
- 25 21. Import into this state or export from this state the carcass or 26 parts of a carcass of any wildlife unlawfully taken or possessed.
- B. Unless a different or other penalty or punishment is 28 specifically prescribed, a person who violates any provision of this 29 title, or who violates or fails to comply with a lawful order or rule of 30 the commission, is guilty of a class 2 misdemeanor.

- C. A person who knowingly takes any big game during a closed season who knowingly possesses, transports or buys any big game that was unlawfully taken during a closed season is guilty of a class 1 misdemeanor.
- D. A person is guilty of a class 6 felony who knowingly:
- 6 1. Barters, sells or offers for sale any big game or parts of big 7 game taken unlawfully.
- 8 2. Barters, sells or offers for sale any wildlife or parts of 9 wildlife unlawfully taken during a closed season.
- 3. Barters, sells or offers for sale any wildlife or parts of 11 wildlife imported or purchased in violation of this title or a lawful rule 12 of the commission.
- 4. Assists another person for monetary gain with the unlawful taking of big game.
- 5. Takes or possesses wildlife while under permanent revocation under section 17-340, subsection $[8-][\underline{C}]$, paragraph 3.
- 17 E. A peace officer who knowingly fails to enforce a lawful rule of 18 the commission or this title is guilty of a class 2 misdemeanor.>>

- 21 17-340. Revocation, suspension and denial of privilege of
- <u>taking wildlife; civil penalty; notice; violation;</u>
- 23 <u>classification</u>
- A. On conviction, ON ENTERING A DEFERRED PROSECUTION AGREEMENT or after adjudication as a delinquent juvenile as defined in section 8-201 and in addition to other penalties prescribed by this title, the commission, after a public hearing, may revoke or suspend a license issued to any person under this title and deny the person the right to secure another license to take or possess wildlife for a period of not to exceed five years for:

- 1. Unlawful taking, unlawful selling, unlawful offering for sale, 2 unlawful bartering or unlawful possession of wildlife.
- Careless use of firearms that resulted in the injury or death of
 any person.
- 5 3. Destroying, injuring or molesting livestock, or damaging or 6 destroying growing crops, personal property, notices or signboards or 7 other improvements while hunting, trapping or fishing.
- 8 4. Littering public hunting or fishing areas while taking wildlife.
- 9 5. Knowingly allowing another person to use the person's big game 10 tag, except as provided by section 17-332, subsection D.
- 11 6. A violation of section 17-303, 17-304, 17-316 or 17-341 or 12 section 17-362, subsection A.
- 7. A violation of section 17-309, subsection A, paragraph 5 14 involving a waste of edible portions other than meat damaged due to the 15 method of taking as follows:

- 4 [8.] [C.] On conviction or after adjudication as a delinquent 5 juvenile and in addition to any other penalties prescribed by this title:
- 1. For a first conviction or a first adjudication as a delinquent juvenile, for unlawfully taking or wounding wildlife at any time or place, the commission, after a public hearing, may revoke, suspend or deny the person's privilege to take wildlife for a period of up to five years.
- 2. [NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION B OF THIS SECTION,] for a second conviction[, ON ENTERING A SECOND AGREEMENT TO DEFER PROSECUTION] or [FOR] 12 a second adjudication as a delinquent juvenile[,] for unlawfully taking or 13 wounding wildlife at any time or place, the commission, after a public 14 hearing, may revoke, suspend or deny the person's privilege to take 15 wildlife for a period of up to ten years.
- 3. [NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION B OF THIS SECTION.] for a third conviction[. ON ENTERING A THIRD AGREEMENT TO DEFER PROSECUTION] or [FOR] 18 a third adjudication as a delinquent juvenile, for unlawfully taking or 19 wounding wildlife at any time or place, the commission, after a public 20 hearing, may revoke, suspend or deny the person's privilege to take 21 wildlife permanently.
- [C.] [D.] In accordance with title 41, chapter 6, article 10 and 23 notwithstanding subsection A of this section, a person against whom the 24 commission imposes a civil penalty under section 17-314 for the unlawful 25 taking, wounding, killing or possession of wildlife may be denied the 26 right to obtain a license to take wildlife until the person has made full payment of PAYS the civil penalty IN FULL.
- [B.] [E.] On receiving a report from the licensing authority of a 29 state that is a party to the wildlife violator compact adopted under 30 chapter 5 of this title that a resident of this state has failed to comply 31 with the terms of a wildlife citation, the commission, after a public

- 1 hearing, may suspend any license issued under this title to take wildlife 2 until the licensing authority furnishes satisfactory evidence of
- 3 compliance with the terms of the wildlife citation.
