SUBJECT: Strike everything amendment to S.B. 1510, relating to conversion therapy;

prohibition; minors

Purpose

Prohibits certain health professionals who provide mental health therapy from providing conversion therapy to a patient or client who is under 18 years of age.

Background

Health profession regulatory boards certify or license health professionals to perform duties and services within a specified scope of practice. Statute outlines actions or omissions that constitute *unprofessional conduct* which vary across the types of professionals. A health professional found guilty of unprofessional conduct by the appropriate regulatory board is subject to disciplinary action, which includes suspension or revocation of a license or certification (A.R.S. Title 32).

There is no anticipated fiscal impact to the state General Fund associated with this legislation.

Provisions

- 1. Deems, as an act of *unprofessional conduct*, a health care professional providing conversion therapy to a patient or client who is under 18 years of age.
- 2. Excludes, from the prohibition:
 - a) a clergy member or religious counselor acting substantially in a pastoral or religious capacity and not in the capacity of a health care profession; or
 - b) a parent or grandparent who is a health care professional and is acting substantially in the capacity of a parent or grandparent and not in the capacity of a health care professional.
- 3. Defines *conversion therapy*:
 - a) as any practice or treatment that seeks to change the sexual orientation or gender identity of a patient or client, including mental therapy; and
 - b) to include mental therapy that seeks to change, eliminate or reduce behaviors, expressions, attractions or feelings related to the patient's or client's sexual orientation or gender identity.
- 4. Excludes, from the definition of *conversion therapy*, a practice or treatment that does not seek to change a patient's or client's sexual orientation or gender identity and:
 - a) is neutral with respect to sexual orientation and gender identity;
 - b) provides assistance to a patient or client undergoing gender transition;
 - c) provides acceptance of and support and understanding to a patient or client;
 - d) facilitates a patient's or client's social support, identity exploration and development, and ability to cope;

- e) addresses unlawful, unsafe, premarital or extramarital sexual activities in a manner that is neutral with respect to sexual orientation; or
- f) discusses the patient's or client's moral or religious beliefs or practices.
- 5. Defines *health care professional* as an individual who provides mental health therapy as part of the individual's profession and is a certified or licensed:
 - a) physician;
 - b) registered nurse, nursing assistant, health aide or practical nurse;
 - c) psychologist or behavior analyst; or
 - d) social worker, counselor, therapist, substance abuse counselor or technician.
- 6. Becomes effective on the general effective date.
