Fiscal Note Memorandum

TO: Members of the House Finance Committee

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SUBJECT: Fiscal Assessment of Proposed Amendment **L.003 to HB 24-1052**

This memorandum is an assessment of the fiscal impact of the attached proposed amendment L.003 to HB 24-1052. This fiscal assessment is for the impact of the bill with inclusion of this amendment <u>only</u>. Any other added amendment could influence the fiscal impact.

Summary of Proposed Amendment

Amendment L.003 reduces the maximum credit amount for qualifying seniors who are joint filers from \$2,000 to \$1,000.

Fiscal Impact of Amendment

With the adoption of Amendment L.003, the revenue impact of the bill will be reduced, from \$140 million to \$87.9 million in tax year 2024, or from \$70.0 million to \$43.9 million in each of FY 2023-24 and FY 2024-25.

Bill's Revised Fiscal Impact with Amendment

Table 1 shows the estimated fiscal impact of the bill with Amendment L.003.

¹ In addition to reducing revenue subject to TABOR, the bill will also shift the refund mechanisms used by a small amount. Specifically, reimbursement to local governments for homestead exemptions will be reduced by about \$279,610 and instead be made via another refund mechanism.
