Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes multiple appropriation clauses that, in total, reduce appropriations originating as federal Coronaviurs State Fiscal Recovery Funds authorized by the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA Funds) by \$67,546,354. It also amends multiple appropriation clauses to authorize roll-forward of previously-authorized appropriations that originate as ARPA funds.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee (JBC) has proposed a budget package for FY 2024-25 based on the March 2024 Office of State Planning and Budgeting revenue forecast. The JBC has included as part of its FY 2024-25 budget package the \$400,000 General Fund revenue decrease that would result from the passage of this bill.

In addition, the Joint Budget Committee has included in its budget package reductions in ARPA funds appropriations and transfers of \$69.1 million (including \$67.5 million in appropriations and \$1.6 million in ARPA transfers) that are included in this bill. These "recaptures" are used in H.B. 24-1466 (Refinance Coronavirus Recovery Funds) as one component of the \$210.6 million General Fund savings generated by that bill that is also included in the budget package.
