#### **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment J.001 (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$45,409 General Fund to the Department of Public Health and Environment for FY 2022-23. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.6 FTE.

# **Points to Consider**

## General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee (JBC) is developing a budget package for FY 2022-23. This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$45,409 for FY 2022-23, reducing the General Fund available for other FY 2022-23 appropriations by this amount.
