Summary of Legislation

The bill appropriates \$6.0 million from the Species Conservation Trust Fund (SCTF) for programs submitted by the Director of the Department of Natural Resources (DNR). The programs are designed to conserve native species that are threatened or endangered under state or federal law, or are likely to become candidate species as determined by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service. The funds appropriated are available in FY 2022-23 and remain available for the designated purposes until they are fully spent.

State Expenditures

For FY 2022-23, the bill authorizes expenditures of \$6.0 million from the SCTF for the projects summarized in Table 2.
