A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A GRANT PROGRAM UNDER THE**
102 **"COLORADO WATER QUALITY CONTROL ACT" TO REPAIR**
103 **WATER INFRASTRUCTURE IMPACTED BY A NATURAL DISASTER,**
104 **AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.**

Bill Summary

The bill creates a natural disaster grant fund and directs the division of administration in the department of public health and

environment (division) to award grants from the fund to local governments, including local governments accepting grants on behalf of and in coordination with not-for-profit public water systems, under rules promulgated by the water quality control commission for the planning, design, construction, improvement, renovation, or reconstruction of domestic wastewater treatment works and public drinking water systems that have been impacted, damaged, or destroyed in connection with a natural disaster. The division may only award grants to be used in counties for which the governor has declared a disaster emergency by executive order or proclamation under section 24-33.5-704, C.R.S.

The division is required to award grants for the 2014-15 fiscal year and, as needed, for the 2015-16 fiscal year, to eligible local governments that have domestic wastewater treatment works, public drinking water systems, or on-site wastewater treatment systems impacted, damaged, or destroyed in connection with the flood of September 2013.

The bill appropriates \$12,000,000 to the fund. On September 1, 2015, the state treasurer is directed to transfer any unencumbered moneys remaining in the fund to the nutrients grant fund.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** 25-8-608.7 as
3 follows:

4 **25-8-608.7. Natural disaster grant fund - creation - rules.**

5 (1) THE NATURAL DISASTER GRANT FUND IS HEREBY CREATED IN THE
6 STATE TREASURY. MONEYS IN THE FUND, INCLUDING INTEREST EARNED ON
7 THE INVESTMENT OF MONEYS IN THE FUND, ARE CONTINUOUSLY
8 APPROPRIATED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND
9 ENVIRONMENT FOR THE PURPOSE SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS
10 SECTION.

11 (2) (a) THE DIVISION SHALL EXPEND MONEYS IN THE FUND TO
12 AWARD GRANTS TO LOCAL GOVERNMENTS, INCLUDING LOCAL
13 GOVERNMENTS ACCEPTING GRANTS ON BEHALF OF AND IN COORDINATION
14 WITH NOT-FOR-PROFIT PUBLIC WATER SYSTEMS, FOR THE PLANNING,
15 DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION, IMPROVEMENT, RENOVATION, OR

1 RECONSTRUCTION OF DOMESTIC WASTEWATER TREATMENT WORKS OR
2 PUBLIC DRINKING WATER SYSTEMS THAT HAVE BEEN IMPACTED,
3 DAMAGED, OR DESTROYED IN CONNECTION WITH A NATURAL DISASTER, AS
4 DEFINED IN SECTION 24-33.5-703 (3), C.R.S. THE DIVISION MAY ALSO
5 AWARD GRANTS TO LOCAL GOVERNMENTS TO ASSIST WITH THE REPAIR
6 AND RESTORATION OF ON-SITE WASTEWATER TREATMENT SYSTEMS, AS
7 DEFINED IN SECTION 25-10-103 (12), THAT HAVE BEEN IMPACTED,
8 DAMAGED, OR DESTROYED IN CONNECTION WITH A NATURAL DISASTER.
9 THE DIVISION MAY ONLY AWARD GRANTS TO BE USED IN COUNTIES FOR
10 WHICH THE GOVERNOR HAS DECLARED A DISASTER EMERGENCY BY
11 EXECUTIVE ORDER OR PROCLAMATION UNDER SECTION 24-33.5-704,
12 C.R.S.

13 (b) GRANT RECIPIENTS MAY USE THE GRANT MONEYS TO PROVIDE
14 A PORTION OF ANY MATCHING FUNDS REQUIRED TO SECURE FEDERAL OR
15 STATE FUNDING FOR THE PLANNING, DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION,
16 IMPROVEMENT, RENOVATION, OR RECONSTRUCTION OF DRINKING WATER
17 AND WASTEWATER INFRASTRUCTURE.

18 (c) FOR THE 2014-15 FISCAL YEAR AND, AS NEEDED, THE 2015-16
19 FISCAL YEAR, THE DIVISION SHALL AWARD GRANTS TO LOCAL
20 GOVERNMENTS THAT ARE ELIGIBLE UNDER PARAGRAPH (a) OF THIS
21 SUBSECTION (2) AND HAVE DOMESTIC WASTEWATER TREATMENT WORKS,
22 PUBLIC DRINKING WATER SYSTEMS, OR ON-SITE WASTEWATER TREATMENT
23 SYSTEMS THAT HAVE BEEN IMPACTED, DAMAGED, OR DESTROYED IN
24 CONNECTION WITH THE FLOOD OF SEPTEMBER 2013 TO RESTORE THE
25 FACILITIES' COMPLIANCE WITH THIS ARTICLE OR THE COLORADO PRIMARY
26 DRINKING WATER REGULATIONS.

27 (d) THE DIVISION MAY RETAIN UP TO ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND

1 DOLLARS PER FISCAL YEAR OF THE MONEYS IN THE FUND TO COVER THE
2 COST OF ADMINISTERING PROJECTS OR GRANTS UNDER THIS SECTION.

3 (e) ON SEPTEMBER 1, 2015, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL
4 TRANSFER ANY UNENCUMBERED MONEYS REMAINING IN THE FUND TO THE
5 NUTRIENTS GRANT FUND CREATED IN SECTION 25-8-608.5.

6 (3) THE COMMISSION SHALL PROMULGATE RULES IN ACCORDANCE
7 WITH ARTICLE 4 OF TITLE 24, C.R.S., AS NECESSARY TO ADMINISTER THIS
8 SECTION, INCLUDING RULES DEFINING WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR
9 GRANTS AND THE CRITERIA TO BE USED IN AWARDING GRANTS. THE
10 CRITERIA MUST GIVE PRIORITY TO APPLICANTS THAT HAVE THE LOWEST
11 FINANCIAL ABILITY TO PAY FOR THE NECESSARY CONSTRUCTION,
12 IMPROVEMENTS, RENOVATION, OR RECONSTRUCTION.

13 **SECTION 2. Appropriation.** In addition to any other
14 appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the
15 general fund not otherwise appropriated, to the department of public
16 health and environment, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, the
17 sum of \$12,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for
18 allocation to the natural disaster grant fund created in section 25-8-608.7,
19 Colorado Revised Statutes, related to the implementation of this act.

20 **SECTION 3. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
21 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
22 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
