### A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING REMOVING THE REQUIREMENT THAT THE SOCIAL STUDIES ASSESSMENT BE ADMINISTERED IN HIGH SCHOOL.

### **Bill Summary**

The bill removes the requirement that the state assessment in social studies be administered in high school.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

1	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-7-1006.3, amend
2	(1)(a)(III) as follows:
3	22-7-1006.3. State assessments - administration - rules.
4	(1) (a) Beginning in the 2015-16 school year, the department of
5	education, in collaboration with local education providers, shall
6	administer the state assessments in the instructional areas of English
7	language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies, as adopted by the
8	state board pursuant to section 22-7-1006, as follows:
9	(III) The department shall administer a state assessment in social
10	studies to students enrolled in public elementary AND middle and high
11	schools throughout the state. The department shall select the specific
12	grades in which to administer the state social studies assessment, ensuring
13	that students take the state social studies assessment once in elementary
14	school AND once in middle school. and once in high school; except that
15	the department shall not administer the state social studies assessment to
16	students enrolled in twelfth grade. The department shall administer the
17	social studies assessment in a representative sample of public schools
18	each school year, ensuring that it administers the social studies
19	assessment in each public school at least once every three years. A school
20	district, for one or more of the schools of the school district that are not
21	included in the representative sample, or a charter school that is not
22	included in the representative sample, may request that the department
23	administer the assessment in the district school or charter school. The
24	department shall administer the social studies assessment in the requested
25	school in the school year following the school year in which it receives
26	the request.

SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act

takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 1 2 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 3 8, 2018, if adjournment sine die is on May 9, 2018); except that, if a 4 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the 5 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act 6 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect 7 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 8 November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor. 9
