A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING HUMAN TRAFFICKING PREVENTION TRAINING BY THE
102 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The bill requires the division of criminal justice to provide human trafficking training to law enforcement agencies and entities that provide services to human trafficking victims. The training may include:

- ! Train-the-trainer programs;
- ! Direct trainings; and
- ! Online training programs.

The training may be provided to law enforcement agencies, organizations that provide direct services to human trafficking victims, school personnel and parents or guardians of students, and any other organization, agency, or group that would benefit from such training. The training must be developed in consultation with the Colorado human trafficking council. When considering requests for training, the division should give priority to requests from areas of the state that have limited access to training resources. Beginning in 2020, the council's annual human trafficking report must include an update on the training provided.

The bill requires the Colorado school safety resource center to include awareness and prevention of human trafficking in the materials and training that it provides.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 24-33.5-523 as 3 follows: 4 **24-33.5-523.** Human trafficking prevention training. (1) THE 5 DIVISION SHALL SERVE AS AN ADDITIONAL RESOURCE TO PROVIDE 6 TRAINING RELATED TO HUMAN TRAFFICKING. THE TRAINING MAY 7 **INCLUDE:** 8 (a) TRAIN-THE-TRAINER PROGRAMS; 9 (b) DIRECT TRAININGS; AND 10 (c) ONLINE TRAINING PROGRAMS. 11 (2) Upon request, the following entities may receive 12 TRAINING FROM THE DIVISION: 13 (a) LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES; 14 (b) ORGANIZATIONS THAT PROVIDE DIRECT SERVICES TO VICTIMS 15 OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING; 16 SCHOOL PERSONNEL AND PARENTS OR GUARDIANS OF 17 STUDENTS; AND 18 (d) ANY OTHER ORGANIZATION, AGENCY, OR GROUP THAT WOULD 19 BENEFIT FROM SUCH TRAINING.

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1	(3) Training curricula provided by the division must be
2	DEVELOPED IN COLLABORATION WITH THE COLORADO HUMAN
3	TRAFFICKING COUNCIL CREATED IN SECTION 18-3-505.
4	(4) When evaluating requests for training, the division
5	SHALL GIVE PRIORITY TO REQUESTS FROM AREAS OF THE STATE THAT HAVE
6	LIMITED ACCESS TO OTHER TRAINING RESOURCES.
7	(5) On or before January 17, 2020, and each year
8	THEREAFTER, THE DIVISION SHALL INCLUDE AN UPDATE ON TRAININGS
9	PROVIDED BY THE DIVISION IN THE ANNUAL HUMAN TRAFFICKING REPORT
10	REQUIRED BY SECTION 18-3-505 (4)(b).
11	(6) THE DIVISION MAY ACCEPT AND EXPEND MONEY, GIFTS,
12	GRANTS, DONATIONS, SERVICES, AND IN-KIND DONATIONS FROM ANY
13	PUBLIC OR PRIVATE ENTITY FOR ANY DIRECT OR INDIRECT COSTS
14	ASSOCIATED WITH THE DUTIES OF THIS SECTION; EXCEPT THAT THE
15	DIVISION MAY NOT ACCEPT MONEY, GIFTS, GRANTS, DONATIONS, SERVICES,
16	OR IN-KIND DONATIONS IF ACCEPTANCE IS SUBJECT TO CONDITIONS THAT
17	ARE INCONSISTENT WITH STATE LAW OR REQUIRES A PREDETERMINED
18	CONCLUSION OR RESULT FROM THE DIVISION. THE DIVISION SHALL
19	REQUEST THAT THE ENTITY OFFERING THE MONEY, GIFT, GRANT,
20	DONATION, SERVICES, OR IN-KIND DONATION SUBMIT A LETTER PRIOR TO
21	THE OFFER SPECIFYING THE AMOUNT OF MONEY, GIFT, GRANT, OR
22	DONATION OFFERED, OR THE ESTIMATED VALUE OF THE SERVICES OR
23	IN-KIND DONATION OFFERED; THE PERIOD FOR WHICH THE MONEY, GIFT,
24	GRANT, DONATION, SERVICES, OR IN-KIND DONATION IS AVAILABLE; AND
25	THE SPECIFIC PURPOSES FOR WHICH THE MONEY, GIFT, GRANT, DONATION,
26	SERVICES, OR IN-KIND DONATION IS TO BE USED.
27	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-33.5-1801,

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1	amend (3)(c); and add (2.5), (3)(e), (3)(f), and (3)(g) as follows:
2	24-33.5-1801. Legislative declaration. (2.5) THE GENERAL
3	ASSEMBLY FURTHER FINDS AND DECLARES THAT:
4	(a) HUMAN TRAFFICKING IS A MATTER OF STATEWIDE CONCERN
5	AND HAS A DIRECT IMPACT ON LOCAL COMMUNITIES, LAW ENFORCEMENT
6	AGENCIES, AND ORGANIZATIONS THAT PROVIDE SERVICES TO HUMAN
7	TRAFFICKING SURVIVORS;
8	(b) Although training resources are available on the
9	FRONT RANGE, MANY AREAS OF THE STATE HAVE LIMITED TRAINING
10	RESOURCES PERTAINING TO HUMAN TRAFFICKING THAT ARE EASILY
11	AVAILABLE OR ACCESSIBLE;
12	(c) Labor and Sex trafficking can happen in any
13	COMMUNITY. ALL AREAS OF THE STATE SHOULD HAVE ACCESS TO
14	TRAINING TO HELP IDENTIFY HUMAN TRAFFICKING AND PROVIDE CRITICAL
15	SERVICES TO HUMAN TRAFFICKING SURVIVORS.
16	(d) TRAFFICKERS TARGET AND RECRUIT CHILDREN IN SCHOOLS IN
17	COLORADO. IT IS ESSENTIAL TO INCREASE AWARENESS OF SCHOOL STAFF,
18	PARENTS AND GUARDIANS, AND STUDENTS OF THE DANGERS OF HUMAN
19	TRAFFICKING. TO ASSIST SCHOOLS, PARENTS, AND CHILDREN, THE
20	COLORADO SCHOOL SAFETY RESOURCE CENTER SHALL ANNUALLY UPDATE
21	AND DISSEMINATE A LIST OF AVAILABLE HUMAN TRAFFICKING CURRICULA
22	TO SCHOOLS, INCLUDING SOME THAT ARE FREE OF CHARGE.
23	(e) The Colorado human trafficking council has
24	DEVELOPED A CURRICULUM AND TRAIN-THE-TRAINER PROGRAM FOR LAW
25	ENFORCEMENT; AND
26	(f) THE COUNCIL WAS ALSO CHARGED WITH DEVELOPING A
77	CURRICULUM AND TRAIN_THE_TRAINER DROCK AM FOR ENTITIES THAT

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1	PROVIDE SERVICES TO HUMAN TRAFFICKING SURVIVORS. THE CURRICULUM
2	AND TRAINING PROGRAMS MAY SUPPLEMENT THE EXCELLENT
3	ANTI-TRAFFICKING WORK BEING DONE BY ADVOCACY AND SERVICE
4	ORGANIZATIONS ACROSS THE STATE.
5	(3) Now, therefore, the general assembly declares that:
6	(c) Resources are needed to fully develop safety plans and
7	practices in Colorado's schools, colleges, and universities; and
8	(e) LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES, ORGANIZATIONS THAT PROVIDE
9	SERVICES TO HUMAN TRAFFICKING SURVIVORS, AND LOCAL COMMUNITIES
10	WOULD BENEFIT FROM ADDITIONAL TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES RELATED TO
11	HUMAN TRAFFICKING;
12	(f) The division of criminal justice and the Colorado
13	HUMAN TRAFFICKING COUNCIL ARE WELL PLACED TO DEVELOP HUMAN
14	TRAFFICKING CURRICULA AND TO HELP PROVIDE TRAINING IN THIS
15	CRITICAL AREA; AND
16	(g) The Colorado school safety resource center is
17	COMMITTED TO CONTINUING TO MAKE AVAILABLE HUMAN TRAFFICKING
18	EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES TO SCHOOLS, PARENTS, AND CHILDREN.
19	SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-33.5-1803,
20	amend (3)(1) as follows:
21	24-33.5-1803. School safety resource center - created - duties.
22	(3) The center has the following duties:
23	(l) To provide materials and training as described in section
24	24-33.5-1809 to personnel in school districts and charter schools, parents,
25	and students regarding the awareness and prevention of child sexual
26	abuse and assault, INCLUDING HUMAN TRAFFICKING;
27	SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act

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takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 1 2 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 3 2, 2019, if adjournment sine die is on May 3, 2019); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the 4 5 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act 6 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect 7 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 8 November 2020 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor. 9

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
