101	CONCERNING A REQUIREMENT THAT CONSENT OF THE OWNER OF REAL
102	PROPERTY BE OBTAINED BEFORE THE PROPERTY MAY BE LISTED

Bill Summary

Prior to taking any action to approve a national property documentation form (form) or to request the approval of the keeper of the national register of an executed form, the bill requires the state historical society to require the applicant to obtain the consent, evidenced by a notarized signature, of each owner of the land and property described in

2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 24-80.1-108.5

5	property in multiple property documentation form.
6	NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW, PRIOR TO TAKING ANY
7	ACTION TO APPROVE A NATIONAL PROPERTY DOCUMENTATION FORM OR TO
8	REQUEST THE APPROVAL OF THE KEEPER OF THE NATIONAL REGISTER OF
9	AN EXECUTED NATIONAL PROPERTY DOCUMENTATION FORM, THE SOCIETY
10	SHALL REQUIRE THE APPLICANT TO OBTAIN THE CONSENT, EVIDENCED BY
11	A NOTARIZED SIGNATURE, OF EACH OWNER OF THE LAND AND PROPERTY

13	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date -
14	applicability. (1) This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following
15	the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the
16	general assembly (August 2, 2019, if adjournment sine die is on May 3,
17	2019); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1
18	(3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section,
19	or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part
20	will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election
21	to be held in November 2020 and, in such case, will take effect on the
22	date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
23	(2) This act applies to applications for approval of a multiple
24	property documentation form submitted on or after the applicable
25	effective date of this act.
