A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE REPEAL OF THE "COLORADO HEALTH BENEFIT EXCHANGE ACT".

Bill Summary

In 2010, pursuant to the enactment of federal law that allowed each state to establish a health benefit exchange option through state law or opt to participate in a national exchange, the general assembly enacted the "Colorado Health Benefit Exchange Act" (act). The act created the state exchange, a board of directors (board) to implement the exchange,

and a legislative health benefits exchange implementation review committee to make recommendations to the board. This bill repeals the act.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:* 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **repeal** article 22 of 3 title 10. 4 **SECTION 2.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 5 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 6 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 7 7, 2013, if adjournment sine die is on May 8, 2013); except that, if a 8 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the 9 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act 10 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect 11 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 12 November 2014 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 13 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
