## **Bill Summary**

The bill allows a state-supported institution of higher education to charge in-state tuition to an athlete residing anywhere in Colorado and

training in an elite level program in Colorado approved by the United States Olympic committee and the governing body of an Olympic, Paralympic, Pan American, or Parapan American sport. The bill removes the requirement in current law that athletes must be residing in Colorado Springs.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:* 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-7-105, **amend** (1) 3 as follows: 4 Tuition classification of olympic athletes. 23-7-105. 5 (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this article ARTICLE 7 to the 6 contrary, but subject to subsections (2) and (3) of this section, every 7 athlete who otherwise would not be classified as an in-state student for 8 tuition purposes under this article may be classified as an in-state student 9 for purposes of tuition at any state-supported institution of higher 10 education if the athlete is: 11 (a) In residence and in training at the United States olympic 12 training center at Colorado Springs; OR 13 (b) In residence in Colorado Springs and in training at the olympic 14 training center at Colorado Springs in a program approved by the 15 governing body for the athlete's olympic sport; or 16 (c) In residence RESIDING in Colorado Springs and in training at 17 a facility in Colorado Springs IN AN ELITE LEVEL PROGRAM IN COLORADO 18 approved by the UNITED STATES OLYMPIC COMMITTEE AND THE governing 19 body for the athlete's olympic, PARALYMPIC, PAN AMERICAN, OR PARAPAN 20 AMERICAN sport. and in a program approved by such body. 21 SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 22 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 23 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August

9, 2017, if adjournment sine die is on May 10, 2017); except that, if a
referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
