101 CONCERNING COUNTY AUTHORITY TO LICENSE AND REGULATE
102 SHORT-TERM LODGING RENTALS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill grants a board of county commissioners the authority to license and regulate any business located or business activity occurring within the county, including short-term lodging rentals or advertising for such rentals, and to fix the fees, terms, and manner for issuing and revoking licenses issued therefor.

12	ISSUING AND REVOKING LICENSES ISSUED THEREFOR. AS USED IN THIS
13	SUBSECTION $(1)(s)(I)$, "OWNER'S AGENT" DOES NOT INCLUDE AN INTERNET
14	HOSPITALITY SERVICE.
15	(II) THE LICENSING OR REGULATION UNDER THE AUTHORITY
16	CONFERRED IN SUBSECTION $(1)(s)(I)$ OF THIS SECTION DOES NOT AFFECT
17	WHETHER A LODGING UNIT IS A RESIDENTIAL IMPROVEMENT, AS DEFINED
18	IN SECTION $39-1-102$ (14.3).
19	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
20	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
21	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
22	5, 2020, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 2020); except that, if a
23	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
24	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
25	within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
26	unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
