A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING A GENERAL DEFINITION OF THE TERM "SMALL BUSINESS"
102 TO APPLY IN SITUATIONS WITHOUT A MORE SPECIFIC
103 DEFINITION.

Bill Summary

The bill creates a general definition of the term "small business" for purposes of Colorado law to apply in situations where a more specific definition does not exist in the statutes. The definition of "small business" created by the bill would not apply to any situation involving a state

program where it is necessary for a state entity to use a different definition of small business or to apply different standards to the criteria governing eligibility for assistance to businesses resulting from conditions on the use of public or private moneys.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-4-401, add (13.8) 3 as follows: 4 **2-4-401. Definitions.** The following definitions apply to every 5 statute, unless the context otherwise requires: 6 (13.8)"SMALL BUSINESS" MEANS, UNLESS OTHERWISE 7 SPECIFICALLY PROVIDED, A BUSINESS WITH FEWER THAN FIFTY EMPLOYEES 8 AND FIVE MILLION DOLLARS OR LESS IN ANNUAL GROSS REVENUE. THIS 9 DEFINITION DOES NOT APPLY IN ANY SITUATION INVOLVING A STATE 10 PROGRAM WHERE IT IS NECESSARY FOR A STATE ENTITY TO USE A DIFFERENT DEFINITION OF "SMALL BUSINESS" OR TO APPLY DIFFERENT 11 12 STANDARDS TO THE CRITERIA GOVERNING ELIGIBILITY FOR ASSISTANCE TO 13 BUSINESSES RESULTING FROM CONDITIONS ON THE USE OF PUBLIC OR 14 PRIVATE MONEYS.

15 SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 16 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 17 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 18 5, 2015, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 2015); except that, if a 19 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the 20 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act 21 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect 22 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in

- 1 November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
- 2 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
