### A BILL FOR AN ACT

# 101 CONCERNING PRESCRIPTION DRUGS IN THE PRACTICE OF OPTOMETRY.

# **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Current law allows an optometrist to prescribe only schedule III, IV, and V drugs. The bill allows an optometrist to continue to prescribe the current schedule III drugs, hydrocodone and hydrocodone combination drugs, when these drugs are reclassified as schedule II drugs. The bill clarifies that an optometrist may charge a fee for prescribing and dispensing drugs for ophthalmic purposes.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-40-102, amend
3	(1) (a), (1) (d) (II), and (5) (b) as follows:
4	12-40-102. Practice of optometry defined. (1) (a) The "practice
5	of optometry" means the evaluation, diagnosis, prevention, or treatment
6	of diseases, disorders, or conditions of the vision system, eyes, and
7	adjacent and associated structures, including the use or prescription of
8	lenses, prisms, vision therapy, vision rehabilitation, and prescription or
9	nonprescription drugs including schedule III, IV, and V controlled
10	narcotic substances for ocular disease, AND HYDROCODONE AND
11	HYDROCODONE COMBINATION DRUGS, so long as an optometrist is
12	practicing within the scope of his or her education as is commonly taught
13	in accredited schools and colleges of optometry and is practicing in
14	accordance with applicable federal and Colorado law and board rules.
15	(d) The "practice of optometry" does not include:
16	(II) The use of schedule I or II narcotics, EXCEPT FOR
17	HYDROCODONE AND HYDROCODONE COMBINATION DRUGS;
18	(5) (b) Nothing in this section prohibits an optometrist from
19	charging a fee for prescribing, adjusting, fitting, adapting, or dispensing
20	DRUGS FOR OPHTHALMIC PURPOSES AND ophthalmic devices, such as
21	contact lenses, that are classified by the federal food and drug
22	administration as a drug OR DEVICE, as long as the drug PRESCRIBED,
23	DISPENSED, OR delivered by the ophthalmic device is not a schedule I or
24	II controlled substance, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF HYDROCODONE AND
25	HYDROCODONE COMBINATION DRUGS.

7	ophthalmic devices, such as contact lenses, that are classified by the
8	federal food and drug administration as a drug OR DEVICE, as long as the
9	activity is within the scope of practice of the optometrist pursuant to
10	article 40 of this title or the scope of practice of the physician pursuant to
11	article 36 of this title.
12	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
13	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
14	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
