#### **Bill Summary**

The bill requires the department of education (department) to create and maintain an online resource bank of materials and resources pertaining to media literacy. At a minimum, the resource bank must SENATE 3rd Reading Unamended May 3, 2021

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include the materials and resources recommended in the media literacy advisory committee's report.

The bill requires the department, upon the request of a school district, charter school, institute charter school, or board of cooperative services, and subject to available resources, to provide technical assistance to a school district, charter school, institute charter school, or board of cooperative services, with implementing policies and procedures, best practices, and recommendations related to media literacy.

The bill requires the state board of education to review and adopt revisions that implement media literacy within reading, writing, and civics standards.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

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- **SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly finds and declares that:
- 4 (a) Freedom of speech is a right that must not be infringed. In
  5 order to protect and reinforce this important right, the functioning of our
  6 democracy requires that Coloradans possess the ability to understand
  7 <u>context, think critically about the information they are presented, and be</u>
- 8 <u>free from indoctrination.</u>
- 9 (b) The growth of social media platforms and their integration into 10 the media diet of Coloradans has created an opportunity for the rapid and 11 widespread dissemination of misinformation; and
- (c) While the increase of misinformation has created significant
  divisions in our society, Coloradans maintain more in common than not.
  Our ability to unite and collaborate toward successful solutions for the
  benefit of all Coloradans depends upon our ability to collectively identify
  and critically examine facts.
- 17 (2) Therefore, the general assembly declares that equipping the
  18 youth of Colorado with the critical thinking skills necessary to analyze the
  19 information, claims, and sources presented to them through media will

1 empower them to make more informed decisions, serve to strengthen our 2 democracy, and protect the health, safety, and welfare of our state. 3 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-2-145, **repeal**(5); 4 and **add** (6) and (7) as follows: 5 22-2-145. Media literacy - committee - report - strategic plan 6 - resource bank - definition - rules. (5) This section is repealed, 7 effective July 1, 2021. 8 (6) (a) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL CREATE AND MAINTAIN AN 9 ONLINE RESOURCE BANK OF MATERIALS AND RESOURCES PERTAINING TO 10 MEDIA LITERACY. AT A MINIMUM, THE RESOURCE BANK MUST INCLUDE 11 THE MATERIALS AND RESOURCES RECOMMENDED IN THE COMMITTEE'S 12 REPORT CREATED PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION. THE 13 DEPARTMENT SHALL CREATE THE ONLINE RESOURCE BANK ON OR BEFORE 14 THE DATE WHEN REVISIONS ARE ADOPTED TO INCLUDE KNOWLEDGE AND 15 SKILLS RELATING TO MEDIA LITERACY WITHIN THE READING, WRITING, OR 16 CIVICS STANDARDS, WHICHEVER REVISIONS OCCUR FIRST, PURSUANT TO 17 SECTION 22-7-1005 (2.6). 18 (b) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROMULGATE RULES, IF NECESSARY, 19 TO IMPLEMENT A PROCEDURE THROUGH WHICH A PERSON MAY PROVIDE 20 COMMENT ON A MATERIAL OR RESOURCE WITHIN THE RESOURCE BANK, 21 INCLUDING A COMMENT RECOMMENDING THE REMOVAL OR INCLUSION OF 22 A MATERIAL OR RESOURCE WITHIN THE RESOURCE BANK. 23 (c) UPON THE REQUEST OF A SCHOOL DISTRICT, <u>DISTRICT</u> CHARTER 24 SCHOOL, INSTITUTE CHARTER SCHOOL, OR BOARD OF COOPERATIVE

SERVICES, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE, SUBJECT TO AVAILABLE 26 RESOURCES, TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO A SCHOOL DISTRICT, DISTRICT 27 CHARTER SCHOOL, INSTITUTE CHARTER SCHOOL, OR BOARD OF

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COOPERATIVE SERVICES, WITH IMPLEMENTING POLICIES AND PROCEDURES,
 BEST PRACTICES, AND RECOMMENDATIONS RELATED TO MEDIA LITERACY.
 (7) A SCHOOL DISTRICT, DISTRICT CHARTER SCHOOL, INSTITUTE
 CHARTER SCHOOL, OR BOARD OF COOPERATIVE SERVICES IS NOT REQUIRED
 TO ADOPT OR IMPLEMENT ANY MATERIAL OR RESOURCE FROM THE
 RESOURCE BANK INTO ITS CURRICULUM.

7 SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-7-1005, add (2.6)
8 as follows:

9 22-7-1005. Preschool through elementary and secondary 10 education - aligned standards - adoption - revisions. (2.6) (a) THE 11 STATE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REVISIONS TO THE READING, WRITING, AND 12 CIVICS STANDARDS THAT IDENTIFY THE KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS THAT AN 13 ELEMENTARY THROUGH SECONDARY EDUCATION STUDENT SHOULD 14 ACQUIRE RELATING TO MEDIA LITERACY. THE KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS 15 RELATING TO MEDIA LITERACY MUST GIVE DUE CONSIDERATION TO 16 RECOMMENDATIONS MADE BY THE MEDIA LITERACY ADVISORY 17 COMMITTEE'S REPORT PURSUANT TO SECTION 22-2-145 (2)(a)(I).

(b) THE INITIAL ADOPTED REVISIONS REQUIRED BY SUBSECTION
(2.6)(a) OF THIS SECTION, AND SUBSEQUENT REVIEWS AND ADOPTIONS OF
ANY APPROPRIATE REVISIONS, MUST OCCUR PURSUANT TO THE STANDARD
SCHEDULE DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (6) OF THIS SECTION.

SECTION 4. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.

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
