CONCERNING A REQUIREMENT THAT THE TRANSPARENCY ONLINE PROJECT WEB-BASED SYSTEM INCLUDE THE NAME OF THE VENDOR PAID IN CONNECTION WITH EACH EXPENDITURE INCLUDED IN THE SYSTEM.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-72.4-103, **amend** (1) introductory portion, (1)(j), and (1)(k); and **add** (1)(l) as follows:

- **24-72.4-103.** Web-based system enhancements procedure for challenging exclusions. (1) The chief information officer DEPARTMENT OF PERSONNEL shall modify the web-based system to meet the following requirements:
- (j) The web-based system shall include a link to the online database; and

- (k) The web-based system shall include county expenditure and revenue data in accordance with section 24-72.4-106; AND
- (1) The Web-Based System Must Include, for any expenditure made to pay a vendor, the legal name of the vendor paid; except that the Web-Based System is not required to include the legal name of the vendor if the state agency has determined that the public interest is best served by excluding the legal name of the vendor or that including the legal name of the vendor is otherwise prohibited by law. When included in the web-Based system, the legal name of the vendor must be included without redaction.

SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in

November 2022 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
