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A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING REQUESTS FOR OPEN RECORDS ACCESS TO DATA COLLECTED BY MONITORING CAMERAS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries.)

The bill says that video or still images obtained by monitoring cameras, such as traffic webcams, may not be released under an open records request, except to the person of interest in the records. The bill also defines "monitoring camera".

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:* 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-72-204, **amend** (3) 3 (a) introductory portion and (3) (a) (XXI); and **add** (3) (a) (XXII) as 4 follows: 5 24-72-204. Allowance or denial of inspection - grounds -6 **procedure - appeal - definitions.** (3) (a) The custodian shall deny the 7 right of inspection of NOT PRODUCE the following records, unless 8 otherwise provided by law; except that any of the following records, other 9 than letters of reference concerning employment, licensing, or issuance of 10 permits, shall be ARE available to the person in interest under this 11 subsection (3): 12 (XXI) All records, including but not limited to, analyses and maps, 13 compiled or maintained pursuant to statute or rule by the department of 14 natural resources or its divisions that are based on information related to 15 private lands and THAT identify or allow to be identified any specific 16 Colorado landowners or lands; except that summary or aggregated data 17 that do not specifically identify individual landowners or specific parcels 18 of land shall ARE not be subject to this subparagraph (XXI); 19 (XXII) (A) ALL VIDEO OR STILL IMAGES FROM A MONITORING 20 CAMERA, EXCLUDING IMAGES OF ANY PERSON ALLEGEDLY COMMITTING OR 21 ATTEMPTING TO COMMIT A CRIME. VIDEO IMAGES OR IDENTIFYING 22 INFORMATION, INCLUDING A LICENSE PLATE, OF A POTENTIAL VICTIM, 23 WITNESS, BYSTANDER, OR OTHER NONPARTICIPANT IN ALLEGED CRIMINAL 24 ACTIVITY MAY BE PRODUCED ONLY WITH THE WRITTEN CONSENT OF THE 25 PERSON IN INTEREST OR THAT PERSON'S PARENT OR GUARDIAN OR THE 26 WRITTEN AUTHORIZATION OF A PEACE OFFICER, DISTRICT ATTORNEY,

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1	JUDGE, OR FIRE CHIEF, OR THAT OFFICIAL'S DESIGNEE, FOR CRIMINAL
2	JUSTICE OR LIFE SAFETY PURPOSES.
3	(B) AS USED IN THIS SUBPARAGRAPH (XXII), "MONITORING
4	CAMERA" MEANS A DIGITAL VIDEO CAMERA, VIDEO TAPE CAMERA, FILM
5	CAMERA, PHOTO RADAR RECORDER, TOLL COLLECTION DEVICE,
6	AUTOMATED VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION SYSTEM, OR OTHER IMAGE
7	RECORDING DEVICE INTENDED TO CAPTURE MOVING OR STILL PICTURES OR
8	IMAGES ON A ROUTINE BASIS OR FOR SECURITY OR OTHER PURPOSES,
9	INCLUDING MONITORING OR RECORDING TRAFFIC, WEATHER CONDITIONS,
10	OFFICE ACTIVITIES, TRANSIT FACILITIES, PARKING GARAGES, SPORTS
11	VENUES, SCHOOLS, DAY CARE CENTERS, HOSPITALS OR OTHER MEDICAL
12	FACILITIES, RECREATIONAL FACILITIES, PLAYGROUNDS, SWIMMING POOLS,
13	OR UTILITY FACILITIES.
14	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
15	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
16	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

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
