1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2           **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 1-1-104, **repeal**  
3 (19.5) (a) (VII) as follows:

4           **1-1-104. Definitions.** As used in this code, unless the context  
5 otherwise requires:

6           (19.5) (a) "Identification" means:

7           (VII) ~~A copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government~~  
8 ~~check, paycheck, or other government document that shows the name and~~  
9 ~~address of the elector;~~

10           **SECTION 2. Applicability.** This act applies to any election  
11 conducted on or after the effective date of this act.

12           **SECTION 3. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,  
13 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate  
14 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
