A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING AN EXCEPTION TO THE REQUIREMENT THAT EMPLOYERS
102	PROVIDE SICK LEAVE TO THEIR EMPLOYEES, WHICH EXCEPTION
103	APPLIES ONLY TO EMPLOYERS THAT HAVE LESS THAN A CERTAIN
104	NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES.

Bill Summary

In 2020, the general assembly enacted, and the governor subsequently signed into law, Senate Bill 20-205 (SB20-205), which required that employers offer sick leave to their employees. SB20-205

included an exception for employers with fewer than 16 employees, but the exception repealed January 1, 2022. The bill recreates this exception to apply in perpetuity.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 8-13.3-403, amend
3	(1) as follows:
4	8-13.3-403. Paid sick leave - accrual - carry forward to
5	subsequent year - comparable leave provided by employer - no
6	payment for unused leave - rules. (1) (a) All Employees working in
7	Colorado have the right to paid sick leave as specified in this part 4.
8	(b) Repealed. ON AND AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS
9	SUBSECTION $(1)(b)$, EACH EMPLOYER WITH SIXTEEN OR MORE EMPLOYEES
10	SHALL PROVIDE EACH EMPLOYEE PAID SICK LEAVE AS PROVIDED IN THIS
11	SECTION.
12	(c) Effective January 1, 2022, each employer shall provide each
13	employee paid sick leave as provided in this section.
14	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
15	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
16	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
