A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING THE CREATION OF AN EXTENDED SERVICE HOURS PERMIT TO ALLOW SPECIFIED PERSONS LICENSED TO SELL ALCOHOL BEVERAGES TO OPERATE DURING EXTENDED HOURS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

Current law restricts the sale of malt, vinous, or spirituous liquors to between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m., and restricts the sale of fermented malt beverages to between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 12 midnight.

The bill creates an extended service hours permit to authorize

certain liquor licensees that are authorized to sell alcohol beverages for consumption on the licensed premises to sell alcohol beverages outside of these specified hours. A licensee must obtain a permit from both the state and local licensing authorities before operating during extended hours.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 44-3-430 as 3 follows: 4 44-3-430. Extended service hours - permit - eligible licensees 5 - requirements and limitations - penalties - rules. (1) WHEN 6 OPERATING PURSUANT TO A VALID PERMIT ISSUED IN ACCORDANCE WITH 7 SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION, IN ADDITION TO THE HOURS OF 8 OPERATION PERMITTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 44-3-901 (6)(b) OR (6)(c), 9 AS APPLICABLE, THE FOLLOWING LICENSEES MAY OPERATE BETWEEN THE 10 HOURS OF 5:00 A.M. AND 2:00 A.M., OR BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 7:00 A.M. 11 AND 4:00 A.M., BUT NOT BOTH: 12 (a) A LICENSEE OPERATING A SALES ROOM PURSUANT TO SECTION 13 44-3-402 (2) OR (7), 44-3-403 (2)(e), OR 44-3-407 (1)(b); 14 (b) A BEER AND WINE LICENSEE; 15 (c) A HOTEL AND RESTAURANT LICENSEE, INCLUDING A LICENSEE 16 OPERATING A RESORT COMPLEX WITH DESIGNATED RELATED FACILITIES 17 PURSUANT TO SECTION 44-3-413 (2) OR A CAMPUS LIQUOR COMPLEX WITH 18 DESIGNATED RELATED FACILITIES PURSUANT TO SECTION 44-3-413 (3); 19 (d) A TAVERN LICENSEE; 20 (e) AN OPTIONAL PREMISES LICENSEE; 21 (f) A RETAIL GAMING TAVERN LICENSEE; 22 (g) A BREW PUB LICENSEE; 23 (h) A CLUB LICENSEE;

11	(2) (a) In order to operate during the extended hours
12	LISTED IN SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION, A LICENSEE LISTED IN
13	SUBSECTION (1) MUST APPLY FOR AND OBTAIN AN EXTENDED SERVICE
14	HOURS PERMIT FROM BOTH THE LOCAL LICENSING AUTHORITY FOR THE
15	JURISDICTION IN WHICH THE LICENSED PREMISES IS LOCATED AND THE
16	STATE LICENSING AUTHORITY. THE APPLICANT MUST APPLY TO THE LOCAL
17	LICENSING AUTHORITY AND THE STATE LICENSING AUTHORITY
18	CONCURRENTLY. THE APPLICANT MUST DESIGNATE ON EACH APPLICATION
19	WHICH EXTENDED SERVICE HOUR WINDOW THE APPLICANT IS APPLYING
20	FOR, AND EACH LICENSING AUTHORITY SHALL DESIGNATE ON THE ISSUED
21	PERMIT WHICH EXTENDED SERVICE HOUR WINDOW APPLIES TO THE
22	LICENSED PREMISES.
23	(b) This section does not require a local licensing
24	AUTHORITY TO ALLOW A LICENSEE TO OPERATE DURING EXTENDED HOURS
25	WITHIN THE LOCAL LICENSING AUTHORITY'S JURISDICTION.
26	(c) (I) THE STATE LICENSING AUTHORITY SHALL NOT ISSUE OR
27	RENEW A PERMIT UNDER THIS SUBSECTION (2) TO A LICENSEE WITH ANY

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1	STATE OR LOCAL DISCIPLINARY ACTION IMPOSED PURSUANT TO SECTION
2	44-3-601 OR AN EQUIVALENT LOCAL ORDINANCE OR RESOLUTION AGAINST
3	THE LICENSEE'S LICENSE IN THE TWELVE MONTHS PRECEDING THE
4	LICENSEE'S INITIAL APPLICATION OR APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL OF THE
5	PERMIT.
6	(II) This subsection (2)(c) does not prohibit an applicant
7	THAT HAS BEEN IN OPERATION FOR FEWER THAN TWELVE MONTHS FROM
8	APPLYING FOR AND OBTAINING A PERMIT ISSUED PURSUANT TO THIS
9	SECTION.
10	(3) AN EXTENDED SERVICE HOURS PERMIT ISSUED BY THE STATE
11	LICENSING AUTHORITY IS SUBJECT TO RENEWAL ON AN ANNUAL BASIS AT
12	THE SAME TIME THE UNDERLYING LICENSE IS RENEWED.
13	(4) THE STATE LICENSING AUTHORITY MAY PROMULGATE RULES:
14	(a) CREATING A STATE EXTENDED SERVICE HOURS PERMIT; AND
15	(b) CONCERNING ANY OTHER MATTERS NECESSARY FOR THE SAFE
16	AND EFFECTIVE IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS SECTION.
17	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 44-3-304, amend
18	(1)(a) as follows:
19	44-3-304. State licensing authority - application and issuance
20	procedures - definitions - rules. (1) (a) Applications for licenses OR
21	PERMITS under the provisions of this article 3 and articles 4 and 5 of this
22	title 44 shall be made to the state licensing authority on forms prepared
23	and furnished by the state licensing authority and shall set forth such
24	information as the state licensing authority may require to enable the
25	authority to determine whether a license OR PERMIT should be granted.
26	The information shall include the name and address of the applicant, and
27	if a partnership, also the names and addresses of all the partners, and if a

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1 corporation, association, or other organization, also the names and 2 addresses of the president, vice-president, secretary, and managing 3 officer, together with all other information deemed necessary by the 4 licensing authority. Each application shall be verified by the oath or 5 affirmation of the person or persons as the state licensing authority may 6 prescribe. 7 **SECTION 3.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 44-3-309, amend (1) 8 introductory portion and (2); and **add** (1)(o) as follows: 9 44-3-309. Local licensing authority - applications - optional 10 **premises licenses.** (1) A local licensing authority may issue only the 11 following alcohol beverage licenses OR PERMITS upon payment of the fee 12 specified in section 44-3-505: 13 (o) EXTENDED SERVICE HOURS PERMIT. 14 (2) An application for any license OR PERMIT specified in 15 subsection (1) of this section or section 44-4-107 shall be filed with the 16 appropriate local licensing authority on forms provided by the state 17 licensing authority and containing such information as the state licensing 18 authority may require. Each application shall be verified by the oath or 19 affirmation of such persons as prescribed by the state licensing authority. 20 **SECTION 4.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 44-3-401, **add** (1)(y) 21 as follows: 22 44-3-401. Classes of licenses and permits - rules. (1) For the 23 purpose of regulating the manufacture, sale, and distribution of alcohol 24 beverages, the state licensing authority in its discretion, upon application 25 in the prescribed form made to it, may issue and grant to the applicant a 26 license or permit from any of the following classes, subject to the 27 provisions and restrictions provided by this article 3:

2	SECTION 5. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 44-3-501, amend
3	(3)(a)(XVIII) and (3)(a)(XIX); and add (3)(a)(XX) as follows:
4	44-3-501. State fees - rules - one-time fee waiver - repeal.
5	(3) (a) The state licensing authority shall establish fees for processing the
6	following types of applications, notices, or reports required to be
7	submitted to the state licensing authority:
8	(XVIII) Applications for the renewal of a license or permit issued
9	in accordance with this article 3; and
10	(XIX) Applications for a permit for or attachment to a communal
11	outdoor dining area or for modification of a licensed premises to include
12	a communal outdoor dining area; AND
13	(XX) APPLICATIONS AND RENEWALS FOR EXTENDED SERVICE
14	HOURS PERMITS PURSUANT TO SECTION 44-3-430.
15	SECTION 6. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 44-3-505, amend
16	(4)(a) introductory portion; and add (4)(a)(VI) as follows:
17	44-3-505. Local license fees. (4) (a) Each application for a
18	license OR PERMIT provided for in this article 3 and article 4 of this title
19	44 filed with a local licensing authority must be accompanied by an
20	application fee in an amount determined by the local licensing authority
21	to cover actual and necessary expenses, subject to the following
22	limitations:
23	(VI) FOR EACH EXTENDED SERVICE HOURS PERMIT, AN AMOUNT
24	NOT TO EXCEED THE STATE APPLICATION FEE ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO
25	SECTION 44-3-501 (3)(a)(XX).
26	SECTION 7. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 44-3-901, amend
27	(6)(b) introductory portion and (6)(c) introductory portion as follows:

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1	44-3-901. Unlawful acts - exceptions - definitions. (6) It is
2	unlawful for any person licensed to sell at retail pursuant to this article 3
3	or article 4 of this title 44:
4	(b) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 44-3-430, to sell, serve, or
5	distribute any malt, vinous, or spirituous liquors at any time other than the
6	following:
7	(c) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 44-3-430, to sell fermented
8	malt beverages:
9	SECTION 8. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
10	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
11	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
12	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
13	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
14	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
15	effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
16	November 2022 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
17	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
