A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE DIRECT CARE PROVIDER CAREER PATH PROGRAM.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries.)

The bill creates a direct care provider career path program (program). This is an expansion of the pilot program that was created by the general assembly in 2002 in southwest Colorado and that repealed in 2008. The implementation of the program is conditioned on the approval of necessary federal waivers. The state board for community colleges and occupational education is directed to coordinate the efforts of interested stakeholders to achieve the common goal of improved recruitment and

retention of direct care paraprofessionals. The bill also specifies that the program shall be conducted statewide.

The state board of nursing (board) in the division of registrations within the department of regulatory agencies is directed to consult with interested stakeholders and promulgate rules implementing the program. The board is required to establish and seek input from a direct care advisory committee (advisory committee), made up of interested stakeholders from Colorado, in the development and implementation of the program. The rules specified shall provide for a 3-tier paraprofessional certification for persons performing the tasks of a nurse aide and identifies the 3 tiers. Certain requirements and restrictions are identified for each nurse aide career level that the rules of the board shall include.

The board is directed to approve education programs in Colorado for education and training of persons participating in the program. The board shall coordinate the education and training efforts with the state board for community colleges and occupational education and the local work force investment boards.

The board and the advisory committee are required to report to the health and human services committees of the senate and the house of representatives of the general assembly, as well as to the governor, concerning certain parameters of the program.

Funding for certification under the program shall be from federal medicaid and medicare programs.

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SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
shall take effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
11, 2010, if adjournment sine die is on May 12, 2010); except that, if a
referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
within such period, then the act, item, section, or part shall not take effect
unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
November 2010 and shall take effect on the date of the official
declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
