A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING INCREASED REPORTING OF OIL AND GAS INCIDENTS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <u>http://leg.colorado.gov</u>.)

Section 1 of the bill requires oil and gas operators to file written reports with the Colorado oil and gas conservation commission and other affected stakeholders for each major and minor "reportable event". Operators must also give oral notice of major reportable events.

A "major reportable event" includes an incident involving:

Produced water, oilfield chemicals, or exploration and production waste; and

- ! The unauthorized flaring, venting, or wasting of:
 - More than 500,000 cubic feet of gas at any drilling or producing well site or at any injection or disposal facility; or
 - ! More than 1,500,000 cubic feet of gas at any transportation, gathering, or processing facility;
- ! A fire that consumes at least these volumes of liquid or gas;
- ! A spill, venting, or fire, regardless of the volume involved, that occurs within 500 feet of:
 - ! A sensitive area, as that term is defined by rule; or
 - ! A park, recreation site, wildlife refuge, lake, reservoir, stream, or urban or suburban area;
- ! An accident that involves a fatal injury;
- ! A blowout or loss of control of a well; and
- ! An uncontrolled release of gas containing 100 or more parts per million of hydrogen sulfide.

A "minor reportable event" includes an incident involving:

- Production waste; The unauthorized release of more than 5 barrels and up to 25 barrels of oil, produced water, oilfield chemicals, or exploration and production waste;
- ! The unauthorized flaring, venting, or wasting of more than 50,000 cubic feet and up to 500,000 cubic feet of gas at a drilling or producing well site or at an injection or disposal facility;
- ! The unauthorized venting or wasting of more than 50,000 cubic feet and up to 1,500,000 cubic feet of gas at a transportation, gathering, or processing facility;
- ! Any uncontrolled fire or explosion; and
- ! An accident involving serious bodily injury.

The commission will post the reports, notifications, and an annual summary on its website in a database that is searchable by operator, location, type of event, date, and other criteria established by the commission.

 - SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 34-60-130 as

BERM or other secondary containment, THE OPERATOR SHALL REPORT the
 spill, shall be reported within twenty-four hours after the discovery of the
 spill, to:

(b) (II) The entity with jurisdiction over emergency response
within the local municipality AND THE LOCAL MUNICIPALITY, if the spill
occurred within a municipality, or the local county if the spill did not
occur within a municipality.

(2) (a) EACH OPERATOR SHALL NOTIFY THE COMMISSION AND THE

 WEBSITE ON A REPORTABLE EVENT FORM SPECIFIED BY THE COMMISSION

10 (II) THE LOCATION WHERE THE EVENT OCCURRED, DESCRIBED BY
11 SECTION, TOWNSHIP, RANGE, AND COUNTY;

(III) A DETAILED TOPOGRAPHICAL MAP OR AERIAL PHOTOGRAPH,
SIZED AT LEAST EIGHT AND ONE-HALF INCHES BY ELEVEN INCHES, OF THE
LOCATION OF THE REPORTABLE EVENT, SHOWING AT A MINIMUM:

15 (A) THE SURVEY SECTION AND THE EXTENT OR LOCATION OF THE
16 REPORTABLE EVENT;

17 (B) WHETHER THE LOCATION IS IN A SENSITIVE AREA;

18 (C) THE PROXIMITY OF THE CLOSEST RESIDENCE; AND

19 (D) THE OIL AND GAS FACILITY LOCATION NUMBER, IF ANY,20 ASSOCIATED WITH THE EVENT;

(IV) THE SPECIFIC NATURE AND CAUSE OF THE EVENT AND, TO THE
EXTENT PRACTICABLE, A DESCRIPTION OF MEASURES TO PREVENT FUTURE
MAJOR OR MINOR REPORTABLE EVENTS DUE TO SIMILAR CAUSES AND A
PLAN FOR IMPLEMENTING THE MEASURES;

(V) A DESCRIPTION OF THE RESULTANT DAMAGE OR INJURY;
(VI) THE EXTENT THAT EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT RESPONSES
WERE REQUIRED, THE SPECIFIC ACTION TAKEN, THE LENGTH OF TIME

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1 REQUIRED FOR CONTROL OR CONTAINMENT OF THE EVENT, AND THE 2 LENGTH OF TIME REQUIRED FOR SUBSEQUENT CLEANUP; 3 (VII) AN ESTIMATE OF THE VOLUMES DISCHARGED AND THE 4 VOLUMES NOT RECOVERED; 5 (VIII) WHETHER EACH WORKER INVOLVED IN THE INCIDENT HAD 6 THE APPROPRIATE CREDENTIALS BASED ON THE WORKER'S SCOPE OF WORK, 7 AND IN PARTICULAR WHETHER EACH WELDER INVOLVED IN THE INCIDENT 8 HAD THE NECESSARY CERTIFICATION AS SPECIFIED BY RULE OF THE 9 COMMISSION; 10 (IX) IF THE INCIDENT INVOLVED A WELD ON STEEL PIPES, WHETHER 11 THE PIPES WERE TESTED BY USING NONDESTRUCTIVE METHODS AS 12 SPECIFIED BY RULE OF THE COMMISSION TO ENSURE THAT EACH WELD WAS 13 PERFORMED PROPERLY AND FREE OF DEFECTS; 14 (X) THE CAUSE OF DEATH OR INJURY, IF ANY; AND 15 (XI) OTHER INFORMATION AS REQUIRED BY THE COMMISSION'S 16 REPORTABLE EVENT FORM. 17 (e) THE COMMISSION SHALL MAKE THE FOLLOWING PUBLICLY 18 AVAILABLE ON ITS WEBSITE IN A DATABASE THAT IS SEARCHABLE BY 19 OPERATOR, LOCATION, TYPE OF EVENT, DATE, AND OTHER CRITERIA 20 ESTABLISHED BY THE COMMISSION: 21 (I) ALL NOTIFICATIONS AND REPORTS MADE OR FILED PURSUANT 22 TO THIS SECTION; AND 23 (II) AN ANNUAL SUMMARY OF ALL NOTIFICATIONS AND REPORTS 24 MADE OR FILED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION. 25 (3) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION: 26 "MAJOR REPORTABLE EVENT" INCLUDES AN INCIDENT (a) 27 INVOLVING:

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1 (I) THE UNAUTHORIZED RELEASE OF MORE THAN TWENTY-FIVE 2 BARRELS OF OIL, PRODUCED WATER, OILFIELD CHEMICALS, OR 3 EXPLORATION AND PRODUCTION WASTE; AND 4 (II) THE UNAUTHORIZED FLARING, VENTING, OR WASTING OF: 5 (A) MORE THAN FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND CUBIC FEET OF GAS AT 6 ANY DRILLING OR PRODUCING WELL SITE OR AT ANY INJECTION OR 7 DISPOSAL FACILITY; OR 8 (B) MORE THAN ONE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND CUBIC 9 FEET OF GAS AT ANY TRANSPORTATION, GATHERING, OR PROCESSING 10 FACILITY; 11 (III) A FIRE THAT CONSUMES AT LEAST THE VOLUME OF LIQUID OR 12 GAS SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (3)(a)(I) OR (3)(a)(II) OF THIS SECTION; 13 (IV) A SPILL, VENTING, OR FIRE, REGARDLESS OF THE VOLUME 14 INVOLVED, THAT OCCURS WITHIN FIVE HUNDRED FEET OF: 15 (A) A SENSITIVE AREA, AS THAT TERM IS DEFINED BY RULE; OR 16 A PARK, RECREATION SITE, WILDLIFE REFUGE, LAKE, (B) 17 RESERVOIR, STREAM, OR URBAN OR SUBURBAN AREA; 18 (V) AN ACCIDENT THAT INVOLVES A FATAL INJURY; 19 (VI) A BLOWOUT OR LOSS OF CONTROL OF A WELL; AND 20 (VII) A RELEASE OF GAS CONTAINING ONE HUNDRED OR MORE 21 PARTS PER MILLION OF HYDROGEN SULFIDE THAT IS NOT CONTROLLED. 22 "MINOR REPORTABLE EVENT" INCLUDES AN INCIDENT (b) 23 INVOLVING: 24 (I) THE UNAUTHORIZED RELEASE OF MORE THAN FIVE BARRELS 25 AND UP TO TWENTY-FIVE BARRELS OF OIL, PRODUCED WATER, OILFIELD 26 CHEMICALS, OR EXPLORATION AND PRODUCTION WASTE; 27 (II) THE UNAUTHORIZED FLARING, VENTING, OR WASTING OF MORE

THAN FIFTY THOUSAND CUBIC FEET AND UP TO FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND
 CUBIC FEET OF GAS AT A DRILLING OR PRODUCING WELL SITE OR AT AN
 INJECTION OR DISPOSAL FACILITY;

4 (III) THE UNAUTHORIZED VENTING OR WASTING OF MORE THAN
5 FIFTY THOUSAND CUBIC FEET AND UP TO ONE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED
6 THOUSAND CUBIC FEET OF GAS AT A TRANSPORTATION, GATHERING, OR
7 PROCESSING FACILITY;

8 (IV) ANY UNCONTROLLED FIRE OR EXPLOSION; AND

9 (V) AN ACCIDENT INVOLVING SERIOUS BODILY INJURY, AS THAT
10 TERM IS DEFINED IN SECTION 18-1-901 (3)(p).

11 (3) (4) The commission may SHALL promulgate rules to
12 implement this section.

SECTION 2. Applicability. This act applies to conduct or
 conditions occurring on or after the effective date of this act.

SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
