Bill Summary

The bill changes who serves as the presiding officer of the board of directors of the university of Colorado hospital authority from the chancellor of the university of Colorado health sciences center to a university of Colorado hospital authority director designated by the president of the university of Colorado.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 1 2 **SECTION 1.** 23-21-513 (1) (n), Colorado Revised Statutes, is 3 amended to read: 4 23-21-513. General powers of the authority. (1) In addition 5 to any other powers granted to the authority in this part 5, the authority 6 shall have the following powers: 7 (n) To appoint one or more persons as secretary and treasurer of 8 the board and such other officers as the board of directors may determine 9 and provide for their duties and terms of office; except that the chancellor 10 of the university of Colorado health sciences center shall be PRESIDENT 11 OF THE UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO SHALL DESIGNATE the director who 12 shall be the presiding officer of the board of directors; 13 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds, 14 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate 15 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
