Bill Summary

temporarily appointed member cannot replace the ex officio member at a meeting of the executive committee.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-3-301, **add** (2.5)
3 as follows:

4 **2-3-301. Legislative council created - executive committee**
5 **created.** (2.5) AN EX OFFICIO MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL MAY MAKE AN
6 APPOINTMENT TO TEMPORARILY REPLACE HIMSELF OR HERSELF AT A
7 MEETING OF THE COUNCIL. A MEMBER TEMPORARILY APPOINTED UNDER
8 THIS SUBSECTION (2.5) SHALL NOT REPLACE THE EX OFFICIO MEMBER AT
9 A MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

10 **SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act
11 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
12 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
13 2, 2019, if adjournment sine die is on May 3, 2019); except that, if a
14 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
15 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
16 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
17 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
18 November 2020 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
19 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
