Legislative Audit Committee. Currently, the legislative audit committee is required to audit the emissions program for motor vehicles every 3 years. The bill changes the cycle to every 5 years.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-4-316, amend (2)
3 as follows:

4 42-4-316. AIR program - demonstration of compliance with 5 ambient air quality standards and transportation conformity. (2) The 6 legislative audit committee shall cause to be conducted performance 7 audits of the program, including the clean screen program. The first of 8 such THE audits shall be MUST BE completed not later than January 1, 9 2000, and shall be completed not later than January 1, 2004 2018, and 10 January 1 of each third FIFTH year thereafter. Upon completion of the 11 audit report, the legislative audit committee shall hold a public hearing for 12 the purposes of a TO review of the report.

13 **SECTION 2.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 14 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 15 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 16 6, 2014, if adjournment sine die is on May 7, 2014); except that, if a 17 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the 18 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act 19 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect 20 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 21 November 2014 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 22 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
