CONCERNING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

**SECTION 1. Appropriation to the department of education for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023.** In Session Laws of Colorado 2023, section 2 of chapter 474, (SB 23-214), **amend** Part IV as follows:

**SECTION 3. Appropriation to the department of education for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023.** In Session Laws of Colorado 2023, **amend** section 2 of chapter 203, (SB 23-094), as follows:

Section 2. **Appropriation.** For the 2023-24 state fiscal year, \$95,313 is appropriated to the department of education. This appropriation is from the general fund and is based on an assumption that the department will require an additional 0.5 FTE. To implement this act, the department may use this appropriation for administration related to public school finance. OF THE AMOUNT APPROPRIATED IN THIS SECTION NOT EXPENDED PRIOR TO JULY 1, 2024, \$50,000 IS FURTHER APPROPRIATED TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR THE 2024-25 STATE FISCAL YEAR FOR THE SAME PURPOSE.



**SECTION 4. Safety clause.** The general assembly finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state institutions.
