A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING COORDINATING COLORADO'S PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND 102 INDUSTRIES FOR WORKFORCE OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS.

Bill Summary

The bill requires the state work force development council (state council) in the department of labor and employment and the department of education to coordinate efforts to:

Provide technical assistance to schools regarding federal and state programs and statutory requirements relating to career and workforce opportunities;

- ! Identify local industry and workforce needs;
- ! Identify existing apprenticeship and training programs;
- ! Develop resources for public schools to partner with industry sector partnerships;
- ! Facilitate industry engagement in middle school and high school classrooms;
- ! Work with other state agencies and industry to develop industry internships and opportunities for high school students;
- ! Identify and share best practices for implementing career pathways and career-ready skills for students; and
- ! Strengthen relationships with state agencies to be an effective point of contact for information and assistance to maximize opportunities for students.

The bill requires the department of education and the state council to report annually on progress in the Colorado talent report.
