Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill extends the advanced placement incentives pilot program (pilot program) for 3 years to 2021.

The bill requires the department of education to report the number of students in the pilot program who enrolled in advanced placement courses during the prior school year and to collect disaggregated data from the advanced placement exam vendor to capture the performance of students who are participating in the pilot program on the end-of-course advanced placement exams.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-95-102, amend
3	(4); and add (5) as follows:
4	22-95-102. Advanced placement incentives pilot program -
5	creation - administration - teacher incentives. (4) On or before
6	December 1, 2014, The department shall develop and make available
7	guidelines for participation in the pilot program.
8	(5) ON OR BEFORE AUGUST 15, 2018, AND ON OR BEFORE AUGUST
9	15 EACH YEAR THEREAFTER, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL:
10	(a) REPORT THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS IN THE PILOT PROGRAM
11	WHO ENROLLED IN AN ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSE DURING THE PRIOR
12	SCHOOL YEAR IN EACH PARTICIPATING SCHOOL DISTRICT, BY COURSE;
13	(b) COLLECT THE FOLLOWING DISAGGREGATED DATA FROM THE
14	ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAM VENDOR TO CAPTURE THE PERFORMANCE
15	OF STUDENTS ON END-OF-COURSE ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAMS DURING
16	THE PRIOR SCHOOL YEAR:
17	(I) THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS IN THE PILOT PROGRAM WHO TOOK
18	END-OF-COURSE ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAMS IN EACH PARTICIPATING
19	SCHOOL DISTRICT, BY COURSE; AND
20	(II) THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS IN THE PILOT PROGRAM WHO
21	SCORED THREE OR ABOVE ON END-OF-COURSE ADVANCED PLACEMENT
22	EXAMS IN EACH PARTICIPATING SCHOOL DISTRICT, BY COURSE.
23	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 22-95-104 as
24	follows:

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1	22-95-104. Notice by department of upcoming repeal. On or
2	before October 30, 2017 2020, but not earlier than October 1, 2017 2020,
3	the department shall provide a notice of the pilot program's upcoming
4	2018 2021 repeal date to the members of the education committees of the
5	house of representatives and the senate, or any successor committees.
6	SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 22-95-105 as
7	follows:
8	22-95-105. Repeal of article. This article ARTICLE 95 is repealed,
9	effective July 1, 2018 2021.
10	SECTION 4. Appropriation. For the 2018-19 state fiscal year,
11	\$260,937 is appropriated to the department of education. This
12	appropriation is from the state education fund created in section 17 (4)(a)
13	of article IX of the state constitution and is based on an assumption that
14	the department will require an additional 0.3 FTE. To implement this act,
15	the department may use this appropriation for the advanced placement
16	incentives pilot program.
17	SECTION 5. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
18	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
19	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

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
