A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING THE REQUIREMENT THAT CERTAIN MEDICAL

PROFESSIONALS MAKE A FINDING REGARDING THE DISABILITY

OF A PATIENT WHO REQUESTS THE USE OF AN ANIMAL AS A

REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION IN HOUSING WHEN THAT

ANIMAL DOES NOT MEET THE DEFINITION OF A SERVICE ANIMAL.

#### **Bill Summary**

The bill requires the following medical professionals, when approached by a patient seeking a companion or emotional support

animal, to make a finding regarding whether the patient has a disability or a finding that there is insufficient evidence to make a disability determination:

- Physicians, physician assistants, and anesthesiologist assistants (section 1 of the bill);
- ! Nurses (section 2); and
- Psychologists, social workers, clinical social workers, marriage and family therapists, licensed professional counselors, and addiction counselors (section 3).
