A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVES FOR PEDIATRIC CLIENTS

RECEIVING ATTENDANT CARE.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill permits a parent or guardian of a minor child who is in a home- or community-based program to serve as the child's authorized representative while also serving as the child's attendant.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

	SECTION 1.	In Colorado F	Revised Statutes	, 25.5-6-1102	, amend
(6) as	s follows:				

25.5-6-1102. Service model - consumer-directed care. (6) The state board shall adopt rules as necessary for the implementation and administration of the consumer-directed care service model authorized by this part 11. Such THE rules shall MUST include a provision allowing an eligible person to designate a family member or authorized representative to be responsible for managing the financial matters associated with the consumer-directed care or to direct the eligible person's care. The designee shall not receive reimbursement for managing the financial matters associated with the eligible person's care or for directing the eligible person's care, EXCEPT WHEN THE ELIGIBLE PERSON IS A MINOR AND IS RECEIVING CARE FROM A PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN.

SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
