A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING CREATION OF THE MARIJUANA DIVERSION PREVENTION

102 GRANT PROGRAM.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill permits the general assembly to appropriate surplus funds in the marijuana cash fund to the marijuana diversion prevention grant program. The bill creates the marijuana diversion prevention grant program (grant program) that is administered by the state controller. The grant program will provide grants to the state patrol and other state law enforcement agencies that share a border with Colorado to prevent diversion of retail marijuana from Colorado and apprehend those attempting to divert retail marijuana from Colorado. The grant program includes a grant review committee consisting of:

- ! The state controller;
- ! The executive director of the department of public safety, or his or her designee;
- ! The executive director of the statewide organization representing sheriffs, or his or her designee; and
- ! The executive director of the statewide organization representing the chiefs of police, or his or her designee.

In a fiscal year in which the general assembly appropriates money to the grant program, a law enforcement agency seeking a grant must apply by August 1. The application must include a description of how the money will be used, a description of law enforcement cooperation in using the money, and the amount requested itemized by personnel costs, equipment costs, and other costs, plus any other information required.

The grant review committee shall award grants based on need and effectiveness. The Colorado state patrol must receive priority in receiving grants.

2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-43.3-501, amend

 FISCAL YEARS. THIS SUB-SUBPARAGRAPH (B) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE
 JULY 1, 2016.

5 SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-30-201, add (3)
6 as follows:

7 24-30-201. Accounts and control - controller - marijuana 8 diversion prevention grants - committee. (3) (a) THERE IS CREATED A 9 MARIJUANA DIVERSION PREVENTION GRANT PROGRAM, REFERRED TO IN 10 THIS SECTION AS THE "GRANT PROGRAM", TO BE ADMINISTERED BY THE 11 STATE CONTROLLER. THE GRANT PROGRAM SHALL PROVIDE GRANTS TO 12 THE COLORADO STATE PATROL AND OTHER STATE LAW ENFORCEMENT 13 AGENCIES IN STATES THAT SHARE A BORDER WITH COLORADO TO ASSIST 14 EFFORTS THAT PREVENT RETAIL MARIJUANA DIVERSION OUTSIDE OF THE 15 STATE OF COLORADO.

16 (b) THERE IS CREATED A GRANT REVIEW COMMITTEE. THE
17 MEMBERS OF THE GRANT REVIEW COMMITTEE ARE:

18 (I) THE STATE CONTROLLER, WHO SHALL SERVE AS THE CHAIR;

19 (II) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC20 SAFETY, OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE;

(III) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF A STATEWIDE ORGANIZATION
 REPRESENTING SHERIFFS, OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE; AND

23 (IV) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF A STATEWIDE ORGANIZATION
 24 REPRESENTING CHIEFS OF POLICE, OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE.

25 (c) (I) THE STATE CONTROLLER SHALL DEVELOP AN APPLICATION
26 FORM THAT MUST INCLUDE AT A MINIMUM:

27 (A) A DESCRIPTION OF HOW THE MONEY WILL BE USED TO PREVENT

DIVERSION OF RETAIL MARIJUANA FROM COLORADO OR HOW IT WILL BE
 USED TO APPREHEND THOSE WHO DIVERT RETAIL MARIJUANA OUT OF THE
 STATE;

4 (B) A DESCRIPTION OF HOW THE LAW ENFORCEMENT ENTITY WILL
5 COORDINATE WITH OTHER LAW ENFORCEMENT ENTITIES AND
6 GOVERNMENT AGENCIES IN ITS EFFORT; AND

7 (C) THE GRANT AMOUNT REQUESTED ITEMIZED BY PERSONNEL
8 COSTS, EQUIPMENT COSTS, AND OTHER COSTS.

9 (II) AN ENTITY THAT WISHES TO APPLY FOR A GRANT SHALL APPLY
10 BY AUGUST 1 OF ANY YEAR IN WHICH THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY
11 APPROPRIATES MONEY TO THE GRANT PROGRAM.

(III) AFTER AUGUST 1 OF ANY YEAR IN WHICH THE GENERAL
ASSEMBLY APPROPRIATES MONEY TO THE GRANT PROGRAM, THE
CONTROLLER SHALL CONVENE THE GRANT REVIEW COMMITTEE CREATED
IN PARAGRAPH (b) OF THIS SUBSECTION (3).

16 (IV) THE GRANT REVIEW COMMITTEE SHALL REVIEW THE 17 APPLICATIONS AND MAKE AWARDS BASED ON THE NEED AND 18 EFFECTIVENESS OF THE PROPOSALS. THE GRANT REVIEW COMMITTEE 19 SHALL GIVE PRIORITY TO A GRANT APPLICATION FROM THE COLORADO 20 STATE PATROL.

SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

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
