A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING PEACE OFFICER STATUS FOR THE ADMINISTRATOR OF**
102 **JUDICIAL SECURITY IN THE COLORADO JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT.**

Bill Summary

The bill designates an administrator of judicial security in the Colorado judicial department as a peace officer who must be certified by the peace officer standards and training board.

1 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** 16-2.5-152 as
2 follows:

3 **16-2.5-152. Administrator of judicial security.** AN
4 ADMINISTRATOR OF JUDICIAL SECURITY EMPLOYED BY THE JUDICIAL
5 DEPARTMENT IS A PEACE OFFICER WHOSE AUTHORITY INCLUDES THE
6 ENFORCEMENT OF ALL LAWS OF THE STATE OF COLORADO, AND SUCH
7 ADMINISTRATOR OF JUDICIAL SECURITY MUST BE CERTIFIED BY THE
8 P.O.S.T. BOARD.

9 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
10 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
11 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
