Bill Summary

Current law requires that a child with a disability be provided with an individualized education program (IEP), developed by a multidisciplinary team that includes the child's parents or guardians. The bill requires the department of education to use the existing special education data and information system to track the provision of language translation services related to IEPs and include such data as part of its annual "SMART Act" hearing.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 1 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-20-104, amend 3 (1)(a)(V) and (4) as follows: 4 22-20-104. Administration - advisory committee - report -5 rules. (1) (a) The department shall administer this part 1. Administration 6 of this part 1 includes the recommendation to the state board of 7 reasonable rules necessary to implement this part 1, including, but not 8 limited to: 9 (V) Required IEP content and procedures for IEP development, 10 review, and revision, INCLUDING THE MANDATORY PROVISION OF 11 LANGUAGE TRANSLATION SERVICES TO PARENTS OR GUARDIANS IN THE 12 DEVELOPMENT OF A STUDENT'S IEP AND FOR THE FINAL IEP PROVIDED TO 13 THE STUDENT'S PARENTS OR GUARDIANS; 14 (4) (a) To comply with this section, the department shall maintain 15 a special education data and information system on children, personnel, 16 costs, and revenues. and such THE data and information shall MUST be 17 used to ensure that state moneys MONEY provided to administrative units 18 under the provisions of PURSUANT TO section 22-20-106 and other 19 applicable revenues are being spent only on special education 20 expenditures. 21 (b) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL USE THE SPECIAL EDUCATION DATA 22 AND INFORMATION SYSTEM TO TRACK THE PROVISION OF LANGUAGE 23 TRANSLATION SERVICES TO PARENTS OR GUARDIANS IN THE DEVELOPMENT 24 OF A STUDENT'S IEP AND FOR THE FINAL IEP PROVIDED TO THE STUDENT'S 25 PARENTS OR GUARDIANS.
