1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-32-121, **amend**
3 (2) as follows:

4 **24-32-121. Colorado resiliency office - creation - director -**
5 **repeal.** (2) This section is repealed, effective ~~September 1, 2022~~
6 SEPTEMBER 1, 2037. Before its repeal, the Colorado resiliency office is
7 scheduled for review in accordance with section 24-34-104.

8 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-32-122, **amend**
9 (6) as follows:

10 **24-32-122. Colorado resiliency office - duties and powers -**
11 **repeal.** (6) This section is repealed, effective ~~September 1, 2022~~
12 SEPTEMBER 1, 2037. Before its repeal, this section is scheduled for review
13 in accordance with section 24-34-104.

14 **SECTION 3.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-34-104, **add** (38)
15 as follows:

16 **24-34-104. General assembly review of regulatory agencies**
17 **and functions for repeal, continuation, or reestablishment - legislative**
18 **declaration - repeal.** (38) (a) THE FOLLOWING AGENCIES, FUNCTIONS, OR
19 BOTH, ARE SCHEDULED FOR REPEAL ON SEPTEMBER 1, 2037:

20 (I) THE COLORADO RESILIENCY OFFICE CREATED IN SECTION
21 24-32-121 AND THE FUNCTIONS OF THE OFFICE DESCRIBED IN SECTION
22 24-32-122.

23 (b) THIS SUBSECTION (38) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1,
24 2039.

1 **SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act
2 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
3 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
4 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
5 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
6 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
7 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
8 November 2022 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
9 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
