Bill Summary

The bill allows a pharmacy located within a hospice inpatient unit to register as a specialized prescription drug outlet for the purposes of providing drugs, devices, and pharmacist services to the residents of the

2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-280-119, amend
3	(11) as follows:
4	12-280-119. Registration of facilities - rules. (11) (a) A
5	prescription drug outlet may register as a specialized prescription drug
6	outlet if it engages in the compounding, dispensing, and delivery of drugs
7	and devices to, or the provision of pharmacist care services to, residents
8	of a long-term care facility.
9	(b) A PHARMACY LOCATED IN A HOSPICE INPATIENT UNIT MAY
10	REGISTER AS A SPECIALIZED PRESCRIPTION DRUG OUTLET IF THE
11	PHARMACY COMPOUNDS DRUGS AND DEVICES AND DISPENSES AND

2	(2) For the 2022-23 state fiscal year, \$9,517 is appropriated to the

6	department of personnel and administration may use this appropriation to
