### A BILL FOR AN ACT

#### 101 CONCERNING AMENDMENTS TO THE FEES ASSOCIATED WITH WATER

102 **POLLUTION CONTROL.** 

### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill amends the statutory fee schedule that the department of public health and environment charges for the discharge of pollutants into state waters. The bill recodifies the existing statutory fee structure and does not change the amounts of the existing fees, but does reorganize the existing fees into 5 new sectors. The bill introduces 3 new fees for regulated activities associated with the application of pesticides, the costs

The bill also extends the existing statutory expiration dates for permits associated with animal feeding operations.

(g) "SIGNIFICANT INDUSTRIAL DISCHARGER" MEAN AN INDUSTRIAL
DISCHARGER THAT MEETS ONE OR MORE CRITERIA ESTABLISHED BY THE
FEDERAL ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY PURSUANT TO SECTION
307 (b) OF THE FEDERAL ACT.

(1.1) FOR EACH REGULATED ACTIVITY LISTED IN THIS SUBSECTION
(1.1), THE DIVISION MAY ASSESS AN ANNUAL PERMIT FEE AND A
NONREFUNDABLE PERMIT APPLICATION FEE FOR NEW PERMITS THAT MUST
EQUAL FIFTY PERCENT OF THE ANNUAL PERMIT FEE. THE FULL AMOUNT OF

15 (b) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY SHALL ANNUALLY APPROPRIATE THE 16 MONEYS IN THE WATER QUALITY CONTROL FUND TO THE DEPARTMENT OF 17 PUBLIC HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT, WHICH SHALL REVIEW EXPENDITURES 18 OF SUCH MONEYS TO ENSURE THAT THEY ARE USED ONLY TO FUND THE 19 EXPENSES OF THE DISCHARGE PERMIT SYSTEM AND OTHER ACTIVITIES 20 INCLUDED IN SUBSECTIONS (1.1), (1.2), (1.3), and (1.4) of this section. 21 ALL INTEREST EARNED ON THE INVESTMENT OR DEPOSIT OF MONEYS IN 22 THE FUND AND ALL UNENCUMBERED OR UNAPPROPRIATED BALANCES IN 23 THE FUND REMAIN IN THE FUND, SHALL BE APPROPRIATED ONLY FOR THE 24 EXPENSES OF THE DISCHARGE PERMIT SYSTEM, AND SHALL NOT BE 25 TRANSFERRED OR REVERT TO THE GENERAL FUND OR ANY OTHER FUND AT 26 THE END OF ANY FISCAL YEAR OR ANY OTHER TIME.

27 (c) IT IS THE INTENT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THAT A PORTION

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1 OF THE EXPENSES OF THE DISCHARGE PERMIT SYSTEM BE FUNDED FROM 2 THE GENERAL FUND, REFLECTING THE BENEFIT DERIVED BY THE GENERAL 3 PUBLIC; EXCEPT THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY MAY DETERMINE, IN ANY 4 GIVEN FISCAL YEAR, THAT GENERAL FUND REVENUES ARE INADEQUATE TO 5 MEET GENERAL FUND DEMANDS AND THAT, AS A CONSEQUENCE, IT IS 6 NECESSARY TO FOREGO, SUBJECT TO FUTURE RECONSIDERATION, ALL OR 7 SOME PORTION OF SUCH GENERAL FUND CONTRIBUTION TO THE DISCHARGE 8 PERMIT PROGRAM PURSUANT TO THIS PART 5.

9 (d) NOTWITHSTANDING THE AMOUNT SPECIFIED FOR ANY FEE IN 10 SUBSECTION (1.1) or SUBSECTION (1.3) of this section, the commission 11 BY RULE OR AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED BY LAW MAY REDUCE THE AMOUNT 12 OF ONE OR MORE OF THE FEES IF NECESSARY PURSUANT TO SECTION 13 24-75-402 (3), C.R.S., TO REDUCE THE UNCOMMITTED RESERVES OF THE 14 FUND TO WHICH ALL OR ANY PORTION OF ONE OR MORE OF THE FEES IS 15 CREDITED. AFTER THE UNCOMMITTED RESERVES OF THE FUND ARE 16 SUFFICIENTLY REDUCED, THE COMMISSION BY RULE OR AS OTHERWISE 17 PROVIDED BY LAW MAY INCREASE THE AMOUNT OF ONE OR MORE OF THE 18 FEES AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 24-75-402 (4), C.R.S.

19 (1.6)THERE IS HEREBY CREATED THE ANIMAL FEEDING 20 OPERATIONS FUND, WHICH CONSISTS OF ALL FEES COLLECTED FOR 21 REGULATED ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATED WITH THE ANIMAL AGRICULTURE 22 SECTOR IN PARAGRAPH (a) OF SUBSECTION (1.1) OF THIS SECTION, AS WELL 23 AS ALL FEES COLLECTED FOR SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE DIVISION 24 ASSOCIATED WITH THE ANIMAL AGRICULTURE SECTOR IN SUBSECTION 25 (1.3) OF THIS SECTION. THE DIVISION SHALL TRANSMIT THE FEES TO THE 26 STATE TREASURER, WHO SHALL CREDIT THEM TO THE ANIMAL FEEDING 27 OPERATION FUND. ANY UNEXPENDED AND UNENCUMBERED MONEYS

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1 REMAINING IN THE ANIMAL FEEDING OPERATIONS FUND AT THE END OF 2 ANY FISCAL YEAR REMAIN IN THE ANIMAL FEEDING OPERATIONS FUND AND 3 SHALL NOT BE TRANSFERRED OR REVERT TO THE GENERAL FUND OR ANY 4 OTHER FUND. THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY SHALL ANNUALLY APPROPRIATE 5 THE MONEYS IN THE ANIMAL FEEDING OPERATIONS FUND TO THE 6 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT FOR THE DIRECT AND 7 INDIRECT COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE PERMITTING AND OVERSIGHT OF 8 ANIMAL FEEDING OPERATIONS UNDER THIS ARTICLE.

9 (1.7) COMMENCING IN 2016, THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH 10 AND ENVIRONMENT SHALL REPORT ANNUALLY TO THE SENATE 11 AGRICULTURE AND NATURAL RESOURCES COMMITTEE AND THE HOUSE OF 12 REPRESENTATIVES AGRICULTURE, LIVESTOCK, AND NATURAL RESOURCES 13 COMMITTEE, OR THEIR SUCCESSOR COMMITTEES, ON THE ENVIRONMENTAL 14 AGRICULTURE PROGRAM. THE REPORT MUST INCLUDE THE NUMBER OF 15 PERMITS PROCESSED, THE NUMBER OF INSPECTIONS CONDUCTED, THE 16 NUMBER OF ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS TAKEN, AND THE COSTS ASSOCIATED 17 WITH ALL PROGRAM ACTIVITIES DURING THE PRECEDING YEAR. THE 18 DEPARTMENT SHALL SUBMIT THE REPORT ON OR BEFORE MARCH 31 OF 19 EACH YEAR.

20 SECTION 2. Effective date - applicability. This act takes effect
 21 July 1, 2015, and applies to fees collected on or after said date.

SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

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
