A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING REPLACING THE TERM ILLEGAL ALIEN WITH

UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANT AS IT RELATES TO PUBLIC

CONTRACTS FOR SERVICES.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill replaces the term "illegal alien" with "undocumented immigrant" as it relates to public contracts for services.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 8-17.5-102, amend
3	(1), (2)(a), (2)(b) introductory portion, and (2)(b)(III) as follows:
4	8-17.5-102. Undocumented immigrants - prohibition - public
5	contracts for services - rules. (1) A state agency or political subdivision
6	shall not enter into or renew a public contract for services with a
7	contractor who knowingly employs or contracts with an illegal alien
8	UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANT to perform work under the contract or who
9	knowingly contracts with a subcontractor who knowingly employs or
10	contracts with an illegal alien UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANT to perform
11	work under the contract. Prior to executing a public contract for services,
12	each prospective contractor shall certify that, at the time of the
13	certification, it does not knowingly employ or contract with an illegal
14	alien UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANT who will perform work under the
15	public contract for services and that the contractor will participate in the
16	e-verify program or department program in order to confirm the
17	employment eligibility of all employees who are newly hired for
18	employment to perform work under the public contract for services.
19	(2) (a) Each public contract for services shall MUST include a
20	provision that the contractor shall not:
21	(I) Knowingly employ or contract with an illegal alien
22	UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANT to perform work under the public contract
23	for services; or
24	(II) Enter into a contract with a subcontractor that fails to certify
25	to the contractor that the subcontractor shall not knowingly employ or
26	contract with an illegal alien UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANT to perform
27	work under the public contract for services.

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(b) Each public contract for services shall MUST also include the following provisions:

- (III) A provision that, if the contractor obtains actual knowledge that a subcontractor performing work under the public contract for services knowingly employs or contracts with an illegal alien UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANT, the contractor shall be required to:
- (A) Notify the subcontractor and the contracting state agency or political subdivision within three days that the contractor has actual knowledge that the subcontractor is employing or contracting with an illegal alien UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANT; and
- (B) Terminate the subcontract with the subcontractor if, within three days of receiving the notice required pursuant to sub-subparagraph (A) of this subparagraph (III) SUBSECTION (2)(b)(III)(A) OF THIS SECTION, the subcontractor does not stop employing or contracting with the illegal alien UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANT; except that the contractor shall not terminate the contract with the subcontractor if during such three days the subcontractor provides information to establish that the subcontractor has not knowingly employed or contracted with an illegal alien UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANT;

SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 5, 2020, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 2020); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in

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- November 2020 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
- 2 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
