A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING THE ALLOWANCE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT TO WAIVE CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR TOXICOLOGY LABORATORIES THAT HAVE BEEN ACCREDITED BY AN ENTITY USING RECOGNIZED FORENSIC STANDARDS.

toxicology laboratories that are accredited by the American board of forensic toxicology or the international standards organization. The bill changes the waiver requirement to allow the department to waive certification requirements if the laboratory is accredited by an entity using nationally or internationally recognized forensic standards.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-4-1304, amend 3 (4) introductory portion and (4)(a) as follows: 4 42-4-1304. Samples of blood or other bodily substance - duties 5 of department of public health and environment - rules. (4) The state 6 board of health shall establish and promulgate such administrative 7 regulations RULES and procedures as are necessary to ensure that 8 collection and testing of samples is accomplished to the fullest extent. 9 Such regulations RULES and procedures shall include but not be limited 10 to the following: 11 (a) The certification of laboratories to ensure that the collection 12 and testing of samples is performed in a competent manner, which may 13 include waiving specific certification requirements for laboratories that 14 are accredited by the American board of forensic toxicology, the 15 international standards organization, or a successor to either organization 16 A NATIONALLY OR INTERNATIONALLY RECOGNIZED ACCREDITATION 17 ORGANIZATION THAT INCLUDES THE SCOPE OF FORENSIC TOXICOLOGY; and 18 **SECTION 2.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 19 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 20 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 21 8, 2018, if adjournment sine die is on May 9, 2018); except that, if a 22 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the 23 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act

- 2 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
- November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
- 4 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
