A BILL FOR AN ACT
CONCERNING PROHIBITING A REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY
FROM LEVYING SALES TAX ON VACANT LAND ANNEXED BY A
NONMEMBER JURISDICTION.

## **Bill Summary**

The bill prohibits a regional transportation authority from imposing sales tax on vacant land that is annexed by a nonmember jurisdiction.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 43-4-602, add (19)
3	as follows:
4	<b>43-4-602. Definitions.</b> As used in this part 6, unless the context
5	otherwise requires:
6	(19) "VACANT LAND" MEANS UNIMPROVED REAL PROPERTY
7	LOCATED WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE AUTHORITY THAT HAS NEVER
8	GENERATED SALES TAX REVENUE.
9	<b>SECTION 2.</b> In Colorado Revised Statutes, 43-4-605, <b>add</b> (1) (j)
10	(III) as follows:
11	43-4-605. Powers of the authority - inclusion or exclusion of
12	property - determination of regional transportation system alignment
13	- fund created - repeal. (1) In addition to any other powers granted to
14	the authority pursuant to this part 6, the authority has the following
15	powers:
16	(j) (III) THE AUTHORITY SHALL NOT LEVY SALES TAX ON
17	TRANSACTIONS OCCURRING ON PROPERTY THAT CONSTITUTED VACANT
18	LAND AT THE TIME THAT SUCH PROPERTY WAS ANNEXED BY A
19	NONMEMBER JURISDICTION IN ACCORDANCE WITH COLORADO LAW.
20	SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
21	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
22	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
23	10, 2016, if adjournment sine die is on May 11, 2016); except that, if a
24	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
25	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
26	within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
27	unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
