## **Bill Summary**

COLORADO TRAINING <u>FUND</u>, <u>AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION</u>.

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill creates in the office of the governor the green jobs

HOUSE 3rd Reading Unam ended March 3,2010

HOUSE ended 2nd Reading March 1, 2010 Colorado training program, which is a 2-year pilot program. The pilot program will offer grants to applicants who train individuals for jobs in the wind, solar, renewable energy, and energy efficiency industries.

The bill also creates the green jobs Colorado advisory council, which will review grant applications and award grants to applicants who meet the requirements specified in the bill.

The bill specifies that the pilot program is to be funded by federal funds received by the department of labor and employment for the purposes of the pilot program and by funds received from the governor's energy office.

Finally, the bill requires the executive director of the department of labor and employment to evaluate the green jobs Colorado training program and report his or her findings to the governor and the legislative committees of reference assigned in the bill.

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Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** Title 24, Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended BY 3 THE ADDITION OF A NEW ARTICLE to read: 4 ARTICLE 38.9 5 **Green Jobs Colorado Training Program 24-38.9-101.** Legislative declaration. The General assembly 6 7 FINDS, DETERMINES, AND DECLARES THAT AS COLORADO CONTINUES TO 8 EXPAND ITS NEW ENERGY ECONOMY, THE STATE MUST ENSURE THAT 9 COLORADO CITIZENS HAVE ACCESS TO THE NECESSARY SKILLS IN ORDER 10 TO COMPETE FOR JOBS IN THE NEW ENERGY MARKET. 13	SECTION 2. Appropriation - adjustments to the 2010 long

17	energy office, will receive the sum of one hundred thousand dollars
18	(\$100,000) in federal funds for the implementation of this act. Said sum
19	shall be from funds received through the American Recovery and
20	Reinvestment Act of 2009. Although these funds are not appropriated in
21	this act, they are noted for the purpose of indicating the assumptions used
22	<u>relative to these funds.</u>
23	(2) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby
24	appropriated to the department of labor and employment, division of
25	employment and training, employment and training programs, workforce
26	investment act, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, the sum of one
